


## Reliable rist Watch

## SOME HINTS FOR GARDENS

RICHARD DIENER, WHO IS HAILED AS  
SUCCESSOR TO LUTHER BURBANK,  
GIVES HIS IDEAS

Richard Diener, a prominent California naturalist, who has made some important discoveries in the hybridizing of flowers and who is being hailed as the natural successor to the late Luther Burbank, gives some ideas for amateur gardeners in the March Sunset Magazine as follows:

The first thing necessary to make a garden is patience.

The next—and it is very important indeed—is to plan your garden. It makes no difference if you merely want to plant a little strip across the front of your house, or have ten acres to make into a formal garden in the Italian style. Either must be planned.

Not only is it possible to have gardens which will bloom all year, but it is simple to make your garden fit your house in ways which in less favored climates are impossible. The owner of a Dutch Colonial house—even if it is set on a lot forty by one hundred feet—may have a garden in keeping. The low green-roofed, white-clap-boarded house may be set off by simple bright flowers. The formal house has its lawn and prim shrubbery. All in keeping—and all for a little patience, a little planning—and following directions.

Does your garden face south? Has it deep, rich, soil, well drained? Is it level? Then you are very, very lucky. You can plant almost anything, and raise almost anything. Nearly all plants will grow for you.
