BISLEY MEET OPENS JULY 4 FOR TWO WEEKS

CANADIANS ELIGIBLE IN TEAMS AND INDIVIDUALLY FOR NUMEROUS GREAT SHOOTING EVENTS

BISLEY CAMP, Eng., June 22. (Canadian Press).—A thousand and more picked marksmen from all parts of the Empire and the British Isles are gathering at this camp for the great two-weeks' shoot of the National Rifle Association, which opens July 4. Canada's team of 18 shooting members, including two former King's prize winners, will face again selected marksmen from the four corners of the world in competition for historic trophies. Greatest of these is the King's Prize, feature of the meet since its establishment in 1860, and emblematic of the Empire's marksmanship championship.

As the Canadian team includes promising newcomers as well as veteran marksmen and two previous King's Prize winners (Company Sergeant Major W. A. Hawkins, Toronto, and Lieut. Desmond Burke, Ottawa), the Dominion marksmen have high hopes of one of their number winning the King's Prize.

The King's Prize is shot in three stages on different days; with service rifles. The first is the qualifying stage, and competitors fire seven shots at each of three distances—200, 500 and 600 yards. The 300 best scorers in the qualifying stage go into the second stage, when each fires ten shots at each of 300, 500 and 600 yard distances. The best 100 scorers in the second stage go in the final stage, the long-distance shoot. This is of 15 shots each at the 900 and 1,000 yard ranges. The winner is the one with the highest aggregate score in the second and third stages, the scores in the first stage serving only the purpose of qualifying the competitor.

The highest scorer in the first stage receives the N.R.A. bronze medal and bronze badge. The highest scorer in the second stage receives the silver medal and badge.

The King's Prize is an individual event. Great team events include the Rajah of Kolapore's Imperial Challenge Cup, which the Canadians have won for the past two years, and which of

course they will defend this year. Teams of eight compete in this, with service rifles.

CANADIAN AT HENLEY RACES

JOE WRIGHT TO COMPETE FOR DIAMOND SCULLS CHAMPIONSHIP ON THAMES

LONDON, Eng., June 22.—Canadians will have an even greater interest in the famous Henley Royal Regatta this year than usual. Joe Wright, Jr., 20-year-old son of Joseph Wright of Toronto, world-known rowing coach, is one of three competitors from outside Britain who will attempt to wrest the Diamond Sculls and the world's amateur sculling crown from Jack Beresford, Jr., winner the past three years.

The Diamond Sculls is most popular of all Henley's historic events, because it embodies contest between personalities instead of crews. The final will be sculled on the last day of the Regatta, which will take place from June 29 to July 2. As Joe Wright made a new world's record for the Henley course at Philadelphia last month, he is considered to have better than an even chance. The course at Philadelphia, like all Henley courses, is not merely named after but is the identical length as the original Henley course on the Thames, one mile, 550 yards.

Joe's record time of seven minutes, 39 and 4-5 seconds, compares with the 8:28 made by Jack Beresford in winning the Diamond Sculls last year.

Beresford, a power in the amateur rowing world, also won the Diamond Sculls in 1920. Besides Beresford young Wright will be up against J. Fruin of Leyden University, Holland, and perhaps W. E. G. Gilmore of Philadelphia. Gilmore's entry is problematical and in any event he is not likely to give Wright serious opposition. Gilmore was eliminated at Philadelphia and Wright subsequently easily beat Gilmore's eliminator. Little is known about Fruin, but Leyden University's reputation in the rowing world indicates that he might be a serious contender in the Sculls. Among the Englishmen are likely to be Gollan, Collett and Edwards, all first rank scullers.

SARATOGA CUP INTERNATIONAL

HORSES FROM ENGLAND AND GERMANY TO COMPETE AGAINST AMERICANS

NEW YORK, June 22.—An international aspect is given to this year's running of the Saratoga Cup race late in the summer at the famous up-state track by the announcement that some of the outstanding thoroughbreds of England and Germany will be included in the high-class field. The race is a mile and three-quarters, weight for age event for three-year-olds and up.

The European thoroughbreds to be brought here in plenty of time for acclimatization and raced against such U.S. nominations as Crusador, Mars, Display, and Boot to Boot are Diapason, Dalmayo and Mendoza from England and Laufjunge from Germany.

While little is known of the German colt, the English entries have uniformly good records and pedigrees. Diapason, a son of Diademenos and Venturosome, is to bear the silks of William A. Read, who has been racing him in England. Dalmayo will represent Albert C. Bostwick, who bought him in England last
