LABOR CONGRESS FOR EDMONTON

Gathering to be Held There on August 22 Will be Largely Attended

CALL OF PRESIDENT

This year the Trades & Labor Congress of Canada will be held at Edmonton instead of in an eastern city and a large attendance is expected, according to word received in this city.

President Tom Moore in issuing the convention call says:

"For 43 years the trades and labor congress has efficiently voiced the aims and aspirations of the organized workers of this dominion, and the results of its efforts are to be found in the numerous labor laws in operation today.

FULL REPRESENTATION

"By the formation, during the past year, of the All Canadian Congress of Labor, which is a dual organization, another attempt is being made to divide the workers, reduce their prestige, and weaken the influence they are now able to exercise on the numerous public questions which affect their interests and well being. This challenge to the trades and labor congress, as the representative body of organized labor entitled to speak authoritatively on behalf of the Canadian workers, should be met by making the forthcoming convention the most representative of any of those held during the past few years. To accomplish this, immediate action is demanded on the part of all affiliated trades and labor councils and local unions, to make doubly sure of their full representation at Edmonton by delegates who believe in and are loyal to the principles of the organizations to which they belong.

"The success which attended our efforts last year, particularly in securing such legislation as the Union Label Registration bill, the Old Age Pension Act, should inspire all to still greater effort in order that the many other important items included in the legislative program of the congress may be enacted into law at an early date.

IMPORTANT MEASURES

"In addition to these matters, which include such important measures as the Eight-Hour Day, Unemployment Insurance, Criminal Code amendments, Reform of the Senate, it will be necessary to formulate plans to secure action by the several provincial governments to give effect to the federal Old Age Pension Act. This convention also presents a valuable opportunity to again consider immigration policies and to emphasize labor's protests against the indiscriminate flooding of Canada with immigrants, for whom there is no opportunity for employment, and which is seriously endangering the established standards of living and cannot fail to intensify the problem of unemployment during the coming winter."
