**TOPLEY STILL IN LIMELIGHT**

LENGTH OF VEIN ON TAYLOR MINE DISCOVERED TO EXTEND THROUGH FOUR CLAIMS

(Interior News)

Most encouraging results have followed the first week of work on the Topley group of Topley Consolidated properties and this still further increases the bright prospects before the company in their enterprises at Topley. Frank Taylor spent Saturday in Smithers after superintending the work on the road, in the building of camps and in work on the claims, and he is very enthusiastic as a result of the first week's work.

For the first week work consisted of surface prospecting and stripping, and Mr. Taylor reports the huge vein on the Topley group, originally exposed for 3,000 feet in length, has now been established right across four claims, a total distance of from 5,000 to 6,000 feet in length and varying in width from four to five feet right up to twenty feet.

**ROAD DIFFICULT**

The untoward spring conditions have worked considerable hardships for the new company, and have made the building of the road more costly and of longer duration than was reasonably expected under normal conditions. This road has now been put through to the property, a cook-house is being built, and the men relieved are gradually being put to work on development of the property.

The mine is less than a mile from the main Taylor discovery now being developed by the Standard Silver-Lead Company, and reports coming from the latter property would indicate that they are in the best ore yet to come

**HALF MILLION TO SEE DERBY**

**HISTORIC RACE TO BE RENEWED FOR 144TH TIME ON EPSOM DOWNS WEDNESDAY**

EPSOM, Eng., May 28. — (Canadian Press).—Two horses stand out in the otherwise evenly-matched field for the Derby—Frank Curzon's Call Boy and Lord Derby's Sickle. These two are inevitably connected in the public speculations with the name of a third horse, Adam's Apple, owned by C. W. Whitburn. Adam's Apple beat both Call Boy and Sickle in the Two Thousand Guineas. Adam's Apple, however, had to do the Rowley Mile in 1.38 1-5 to win by a head from Call Boy, with Sickle coming up strong; and the Derby is over a harder and longer course—the historic mile and a half on Epsom Downs.

The Derby will be run on Epsom Downs for the 144th time next Wednesday, June 1. Probably half a million people will see the running of a race with unique traditions, with many interwoven romances and tragedies, and the day before the race the half million will ask—"will it rain tomorrow?" The last three Derbies have been run in a downpour of rain, that turned the Downs into a pool-ridden muddy waste.

**CHANGES AT EPSOM**

Some changes surround the 144th running of the race, which itself never changes. The new grandstand is at last ready—a magnificent structure in modern style, double-decked; with luncheons, halls and restaurants—supplanting the 98 year old structure that accommodated a small portion of the multitude until now. And of course the last hour Derby betting for the first time will be conducted under betting tax conditions.

But the race itself remains as it always was—the thrilling contest of thoroughbreds in the biggest race of their careers; racing for leadership that if held at the winning post gives them lasting prestige.

The Derby will be worth about \$55,000. The race this is not the richest in the world. Neither is the course the best, for purely racing purposes, but a Derby winner has to be a good horse. The runners start at the new high level starting post and ascend for half a mile; after another half mile they turn into the old Derby course, and the last half mile is straight. The abrupt turn at Tattenham corner and the severe descent after the turn is made, is held to be a disadvantage. Steve Donoghue knows this course as no other living jockey does; he has ridden a Derby winner six times. He may ride Lady Eleanor Torrington's Vane this year.

**DERBY STORIES**

When old-timers get to swapping Derby stories—and the stock is inexhaustible—two always rise to mind. Both are of a sombre tint. The first is the fraud of the Derby of 1844, when a four-year-old, Maccabeus, won, painted as three-year-old Running Rein. Subsequently largely due to the efforts of Lord George Bentinck, the fraud was uncovered, and victory credited to Col. Peel's Orlando, who had finished second. The second tale is that of a fanatical suffragist who ran out on the course and brought down the King's horse Anmer, in the Derby of 1913, sustaining injuries which proved fatal.

**STOLE LIQUOR AND CORKSCREW**

ENGLISHMAN WHO ENGAGED IN HAZARDOUS SCHEME IS BANKRUPT AS RESULT

LONDON, May 28.—Pirates operating off "rum row," Sandy Hook, were described as being solely responsible for the financial difficulties of Lieut. Col. John Allan Rule, of Carlton Mansions, Pall Mall, who appeared in the London bankruptcy court for examination.

Accounts had been filed showing liabilities of £37,021, of which £30,008 was unsecured, and assets of £1,157.

Toward the end of 1923, said the debtor, he became interested in a scheme for the exportation of brandy and champagne from France to the "high seas." Col. Rule and some of his friends staked their "fortunes" on this.
