LONDON, March 8. Queen Mary has shattered another tradition. Under the new order of things, when she a-shopping goes, she is no longer addressed as "Your Majesty" by store attendants but as "Madame" instead.

This change in the age-old custom of royalty always being reminded of their exalted position, even when strolling about the shops, has been brought about by the Queen herself because she tired of so much "fuss" being made over her. She takes the view that when she appears to buy something she should be treated the same as any other customer, and there should be no scurrying about and bowing and scraping as in days of

The Queen has a passion for shopping. She is fond of seeking the out-of-theway stores of London, in Windsor, and various other towns. Bric-a-brac novelties and antiques are her specialities.

Her Majesty is the most enthusiastic democratic shopping queen England has ever had. Queen Victoria insisted upon much more formality, and was always accompanied by a lady-in-waiting or two. Queen Mary often goes out alone. She is also familiar with all the little details of travel, though the details are seen to by attendants. Queen Victoria had no desire to be bothered with travel



OTTAWA, March 8 .- The Civil Service Commission is advertising for a carilloneur for the new carillon bells which are 25c to be installed in the Victory Tower of the Parliament Buildings, and which are expected to be played for the first time at the inauguration of the Diamond Jubilee celebration of Confederation next

> The duties as stated are to give formal public recitals at such times as required by the Department of Public 25c Works, including Sundays and statutory 25c holidays, the duration of the recitals 15c and the selections to be such as ap-25c proved of by the department. PRE-EMPTIONS

Vacant, unreserved, surveyed Crown lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 18 years of age, and by aliens on declaring intention become British subjects conditional upon residence, occapation, and improvement for agricultural

ernment Agent Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes, and which is not timberland, i.e., carrying over 8,000 board feet per acre west of the Coast Range

and 5,000 feet per acre east of that Applications for pre-emptions are to be addressed to the Land Commissioner of the Land Recording Division, in which the land applied for is situated, and are made on printed forms, copies of which can be lobtained from the Land Commissioner. Pre-emptions must be occupied for five years and improvements made to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivating at least five acres, before a Crown Grant can be


