WORK OF YEAR REVIEWED AND RECOMMENDATIONS MADE FOR IMPROVEMENTS IN 1927

The report of the fire chief for the year 1926 was rend at the meeting of the city council last night and showed that the department had answered fifty calls during the year, forty-three which had been received by phone, five from box alarms, one test alarm, and one still alarm.

The report showed that the total amount of damage from fire and water of insurance paid covering damages was \$160,245.58, leaving an actual loss to property owners of only \$500.

The department during the year made 360 inspections of business houses. hotels, schools, hospital and moving picture house and gave one hundred and ten verbal and seventy-five written notwo deaths from fire, Mrs. Alberta Danie and Captain Martin Fotland.

Improvements recommended in the report included an eight inch main from Fulton Street along Eighth Avenue to Hays Cove Avenue with hydrants and also that a hydrant be placed near the hospital on Fifth Avenue.

The report further showed that the total expenditure for the year in connection with the maintenance of the fire department amounted to \$16.511.42.
