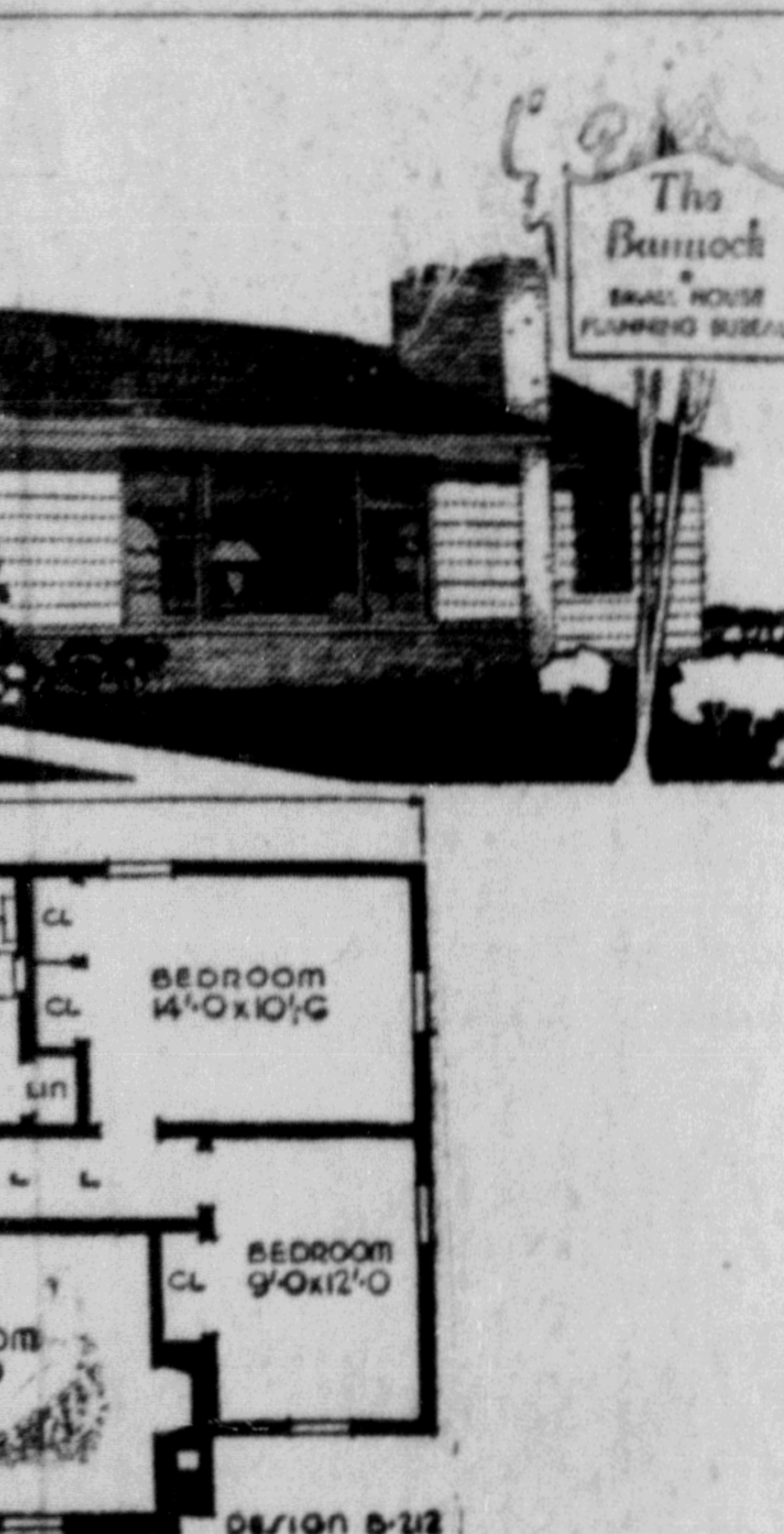
Dogs Trained By Method Of Obedience

Through "obedience-training," a new and rewarding hobby of the dog world, the day may soon come when we can call every dog a gentleman.
Some 300 obedience-training clubs and classes have been organized and listed; dog authorities believe that scores more are unrecorded. More than 2,500 Girl Scouts have participated in obedience-training classes as part of their scouting program.
Dog lovers have found that obedience-training techniques can teach their pets to do many things formerly considered beyond the grasp of the average dog, according to an article in Reader's Digest magazine.
Through patient repetition of commands, dogs are being taught "good manners"—to come promptly and without fail when called, to heel, to run, to walk, to sit quietly in one place until told to move, and even to greet guests without jumping up and muddying their clothes with dirty paws.
The secret of this teaching, the author says, is that the dog desires above all else praise and affection from his master, and he gets this reward when he does as he is told. Punishment is never tolerated in obedience-training. Obedience trained dogs are happier than untrained dogs because they know at all times that they can do what is expected of them.

'Grey Cup' Special to Carry Fans

EDMONTON—A special "Grey Cup" train for followers of Frankie Filchock's western champions, the Edmonton Eskimos, will be operated from here to Toronto and return by the Canadian National Railways.
Leaving here at 8 p.m. Nov. 26, the special will arrive at the queen city at 6:30 a.m. Saturday. It will also be available for a quick return to the west by leaving Toronto at 1:00 a.m. Sunday, following the playing of the football classic between the East and the West.
More than 300 people will travel on the special train, featuring a recreational car as well as 11 sleepers, two diners, two coaches and a baggage car, for both the east and westbound journeys.

Drastic Jump Bidding Leaves You in the Dark

When your partner opens the bidding, a response of one more than necessary in a new suit is universally regarded as a game force. Just how much do you need to make such a bid?
Authorities are pretty much in agreement that you should have about a trick better than an opening bid yourself, plus a good fit in partner's suit. Lacking a fit with partner's suit, you should have a stronger hand.
This is all right—provided you throw in some good judgment of your own. One angle to consider is bidding space. When you jump to three hearts over partner's opening spade bid, for example, he is forced to rebid at the four level if he has a second suit to show. Here, even though you have the minimum high card requirements outlined as previously, it is sometimes better to forego the jump shift in the interests of exchanging fuller information at the lower ranges.
When the jump-shift can be made at the two level it is usually best to make it at once, thus taking the strain off partner and making room for many descriptive and helpful additional bids before game level is reached.
This latter situation is illustrated in today's deal. Mr. Champion opened with one club and Mr. Muzzy bid only one diamond. Mr. Champion rebid one no trump and now, with a great show of daring, Mr. Muzzy jumped to six diamonds. Certainly Mr. Champion could not possibly be expected to go on to seven, which is ice-cold.
With 11 winners, there was no reason for Mr. Muzzy to worry about his lack of fit with his partner's club bid. He should have bid two diamonds on the first round. That would have enabled a good partnership to reach seven without guessing.
Over two diamonds Mr. Champion would have bid two no trump. Since there was no chance of having the bidding dropped below game, Mr.
