They are not every-day menus—they are different, very different, and will add laurels to any housewife's culinary achievements. Mustardof course—is the secret of their savouriness. Clip these recipes for future reference.

ROAST PORK-BRUSSELS STYLE

Cover a piece of pork (fillet or other) with a coat of Colman's Mustard, mix with a piece of butter the size of a nut, salt and pepper to suit. Place the roast in a hot oven, when it begins to color, baste it; let it brown, baste again after adding to the sauce . tablespoonfuls of milk. During the cooking, baste the roast several times by adding at intervals milk to the juice. Pork thus prepared is casy to digest and has a very agreeable chicken-like flavor.

BREADED LAMB CHOPS 8 French chops; 2 tablespoons butter; 4 tablespoons flour; cup chopped ham; 1/2 teaspoonful salt; Cayenne; 1 cup milk; 1/2

teaspoon Colman's Mustard. Make a thick white sauce, when thoroughly cooked, add ham and set aside to cool. Broil chops, season with salt, Colman's Musboth sides with a layer of sauce. Let stand on buttered plate till crumbs. Fry in deep fat. Garnish with paper frills and serve with Cuban or tomato sauce.

CASSEROLE OF EGGS

BAKED VIRGINIA HAM

Select a slice of ham 1 inch thick. Mix together 2 heaping teaspoons Colman's Mustard with 1/4 cup vinegar. Spread over the ham. Slice apples enough to cover ham. Sprinkle 1/2 cup brown sugar over the whole. Stick whole cloves through the slices of apple every 2 inches apart. Put in baking pan and bake in moderate oven from 11/2 to 2 hours. Keep water enough in pan to keep liquid boiling. This is delicious served with baked

When ham is ready to serve, remove cloves, but serve the apples. The brown sugar, mustard and vinegar give the ham a most delight-

FISH SALAD

Take the remnants of fried fish left over from a previous meal. Remove the bones and hash it to fill 2 cups. Add to it 1/2 cup of celery cut in pieces, 5 radishes cut fine, and mix the whole thoroughly. On this mixture pour 1/2 cup of well-seasoned mayonnaise sauce made with Colman's Mustard. To serve, dress a salad dish with fresh lettuce leaves of medium size. Lay out the salad and pour the mayonnaise over it. Finish with 1/2 cup of small or medium sized French peas spread on the top. Garnish the edge with thin lemon slices, and small bouquets of parsley. This salad is just as delicious made with chicken, veal or pork.
