when the boys, much grieved at the loss of an old friend of ten years standing, found it advisable to get the conventional brick and sack and throw her over. That was the end of the office cat who, however, was ample in her progeny and whose offspring have travelled to many parts of the world beside those orphan descendants still resident in these parts.

Old Larsen on Thursday morning launched from the Albert & McCaffery dock a 30 foot two man halibut boat which he built at his residence on Eighth Avenue West. The vessel successfully took the water and is now being outfitted preparatory to embarking on her maiden voyage. She is powered with an 8 h.p. Easthope engine.

Preparatory to the opening of the sockeye fishing season tomorrow night at midnight, there was a last-minute rush during the week of Skeena River canneries tenders on various business missions to the city. Thursday morning, fourteen such boats were tied up at the Prince Rupert Boat House. By afternoon, the most of them had departed homewards.

Duncan McKenzie, pontoon foreman at the dry dock, has purchased a 4 h.p. Easthope engine for installation in his pleasure boat replacing a two-cylinder Kelly-Perfection motor which has outlived its usefulness.

P.R.B.H. powerboat Myfanwy has again been chartered for fishery patrol and will be leaving in a few days to take up her duties.

AN OFFICER'S WORD

The provincial police boat Adanac, jointly commanded by Capt. Raybone and Chief Engineer Tommy Camm, returned to port this week after a ten day patrol trip to the south of the district. The proud officers broke another record this time by making eleven knots per hour between Bella Coola and Ocean Falls with their 5-knot vessel. Of course, no one has any right to doubt an officer's word but it looks like they made some rash statements sometimes.

The new seineboat Bertha G., built during the winter at the dry dock for R. Gammon, T. Watt and Alfred Swanson, left at 7 o'clock Wednesday morning, with Capt. Alex Ohman in command, for Walker Lake where she will take up charter work in connection with the B.C. Packers' new cannery.

The owners of the vessel are loud in their praises of the workmanship at the dry dock which turned out this, one of the biggest and best seineboats in local waters. They are satisfied and opine that they had a better job done here than most of the yards on the coast could have turned out.

Work of reconstruction of the government wharf, for which they were recently awarded the contract, was started Friday morning by the Rupert-Vancouver Stevedoring Co. The old work is now being taken out preparatory to starting the new.

BREEDING RECORD

Something in the way of a record is claimed by Capt. Swanson for a recent litter at the Kinnahan Island fox farm. One of the foxes gave birth to fourteen pups all of which were regular in size and healthy. The average litter is seven or eight. Cap and his associates are now busy trying to figure out how quick they'll be able to retire at the rate of \$680 a skin on the English market.

The steady gain, which it is hoped may yet bring this year's total halibut landings to a figure in excess of last year's, is still to be noted. During the past week (Saturday to Friday inclusive) a total of 798,500 pounds was landed here as compared with last year's total for a similar period of 733,500 pounds. The total for the present season to date now stands at 10,672,300 pounds as compared to 11,347,300 pounds at a similar date last year.

American landings now total 7,650,600 pounds and Canadian 3,021,700 pounds as compared with respective figures at

a similar date last year of 8,357,700 and 2,989,300 pounds.

There was comparatively little fluctuation in prices during the past week. The high American bid was 15c and 7c which was paid on Tuesday to the Muria and Reliance, both of which had catches of 17,000 pounds. The highest price paid for Canadian fish 13.4c and 7.5c which the Ternsen and D.S.T. received on Friday for catches of 14,000 and 9,000 pounds respectively. Lowest prices were 12c and 6c for American on Friday and 12c and 6c for Canadian on Saturday and Monday.

The San Francisco power yachts Simba and Triton, owned by Stewart Edward White and Robert E. Pinkerton, famous authors, in the course of an extended cruise of the British Columbia and Alaskan coast, sailed at 3 o'clock this morning for Ketchikan after a day and a half's visit at Prince Rupert.

The larger yacht Sueja III, owned by Capt. Griffiths, head of the Coastwise Steamship & Barge Co., which arrived at noon yesterday from Seattle, also departed at daybreak this morning to visit Seawart and Anyox. Capt. Griffiths is accompanied on this trip by Mrs. Griffiths as well as a party of young people.

Many local people turned out at the Prince Rupert Boat House last evening to look the yachts over. Not much was seen, however, of the distinguished personages on board as they modestly kept inside their boats away from the curious bystanders. Mr. White proved a very genial individual during his stay and honored Alf, Bob, Laurie, Alex and the rest with his presence at a "mug-up" in the boathouse kitchen during the day. He quietly picked up a good deal of information which he may incorporate in a future novel as well as a description of his hosts' table manners.

The Tricer visitors stated that at least three more Californian yachts might be expected here within the next ten days.

The commercial traveller boats Mac and Mac and Red Arrow arrived at the Prince Rupert Boat House last evening from Vancouver in the course of periodical trips north with drummers on board.
