BEACON FIRES FROM COAST TO COAST TO CELEBRATE DOMIN-ION'S BIRTHDAY

UNIVERSAL OBSERVANCE

PRINCE OF WALES' VISIT ON THIS OCCASION TO BE MORE OF OF-FICIAL TOUR THAN HIS RE-CENT TRIPS TO CANADA

OTTAWA, Feb. 5 .-- (By Canadian Press) .- Plans are rapidly maturing for celebration of Dominion of Canada Confederation's 60th birthday on July 1, of this year. It is now almost definite that H.R.H. the Prince of Wales will be in Canada for part of the summer at least, and it is understood that this year's visit will be more in the nature of an official tour than any since his first coming to Canada in 1919. Premier Stanley Baldwin's plans are not known yet, but in official circles in Ottawa he is still expected.

The government, working with the Association of Canadian Clubs, and indirectly with all the Canadian Clubs of the Dominion, is organizing for the celebration. An inter-departmental committee under the chairmanship of Dr. O. D. Skelton, Under Secretary of State for External Affairs, is being formed to advise the government and to make recommendations to the Canadian clubs and other patriotic organizations. Shortly a national committee probably under the chairmanship of Premier King will be formed to co-ordinate all the efforts being made for the Diamond Jubilee. It is improbable that the actual cele-

bration will be confined to a single day. Programes of various kinds will be worked out extending over several days. There will be distinguished visitors from all parts of the world, including representatives of the governments of the sister dominions of the British

ENGLAND ANXIOUS OVER ELLEN TERRY

LONDON, Feb. 5 .- Canadian Press) .-Not since the last illness of Queen Alexandra has such a thrill of anxiety permeated everybody over thirty as over the illness of Dame Ellen Terry. "Dear Ellen Terry," as she is to thousands who have never spoken to her, is almost the last of the household names of the Victorian era. One can imagine how tiresome a patient she must make, because she never could sit still, but was always flitting about the room; and she uses her hands when talking with an easy freedom of gesture unusual with English ladies. We all used to talk of the voix d'or of Sarah Bernhardt. But the Terry voice is equally beautiful. There have been some who said that Marion Terry was a better actrees than Ellen, a view never shared by the great public. Of all her beautiful performances, Ellen Terry's Beatrice in "Much Ado" was perhaps the most incomparably fascinating. Her Olivia, at an age when others would not have dared to play such a girlish part, approached perfection. Her Queen Henrietta Maria was regal and pathetic. Her Lady Macbeth has been immortalised by the brush of Sargent. Her Portia was so superb as to make one pause thirty years after and feel sheer joy at being old enough to hav
