Default in complying with the provisions of this section renders the person liable, upon summary conviction, to a fine of \$10.00 for each day during which his default continues.

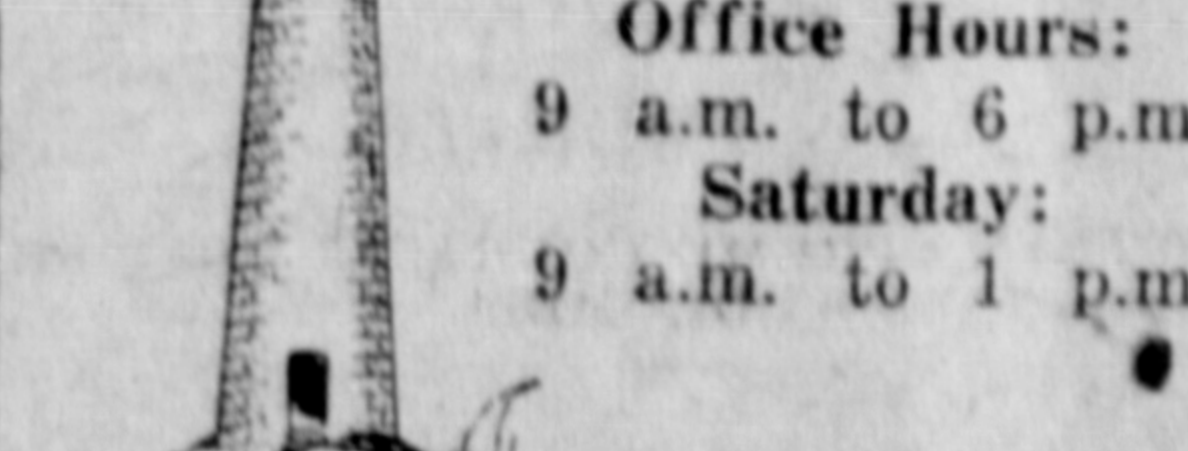

NOW FATHER MAY COOL OFF

AFTER HAVING BOWED ALL WINTER TO GOD OF FASHION

WINNIPEG, April 12. — (Canadian Press)—The Tribune says in an editorial entitled "Sacrificing Father": "Now that spring is coming the male Canadian will get a chance to cool off a little. Indoors, modern women now wear the same sort of clothing both winter and summer. 'We'd as' any time is simply not the thing. It is old fashioned, and may be all right in the backwoods and the settler's shack, but the modern city maid and matron will have none of it."
"The result is, of course, that inside the house it might be perpetual summer if one were to judge the climate by the thermometer, seventy-five degrees Fahrenheit is not an abnormal temperature in an average Canadian home in winter. Sarcastic remarks from the women folk to the effect that the house is "like a barn" are vented upon the nominal head of the household if for a few minutes he should permit the thermometer to drop ever so slightly below 70.

"Due to the feminine fashion it is necessary that father stoke the furnace as full blast to keep the dear things warm. The fact that he himself may be appropriately clad in woollens and tweeds counts for nothing. And at evening affairs, such as dinner parties, musicales and dances, he is the victim of accumulate agonies. He is forced to divide his time between conversing agreeably under tropical conditions in the drawing room and playing winter golf with the bunkers in the basement."
"Some day it may occur to the women to turn. Men may refuse longer to be sacrificed as burnt offerings to the great god, Fashion. At one of these functions the host will insist on appearing in his wife's drawing room appropriately clad in a suit of light-weight union overalls."
