**DOG'S STRIDES ARE BEING DISCUSSED**  
Bounding Gallop is More Disturbing Than Tread of Horse  
PENDER HARBOR, Jan. 25.—(By Canadian Press).—What is the best stride your dog can make?  
Winter affords a good opportunity for dog owners to make some interesting discoveries about their pets' methods of propulsion. If your dog is an active animal, and most dogs enjoy a run in the snow you will be astonished on measuring the space between different sets of tracks, at the distance spanned in the course of his bounding gallop.  
The record here, made by a black and tan terrier running over a patch of fresh snow, was nine feet. A greyhound's leaping stride would easily double that.  
This may have some bearing on why engineers object to having dogs on bridges under construction. It is stated that the disturbance created by their gait exceeds that caused by the average horse.
