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angora Developing Rapidly as Centre of Government of Republic

ANGORA, Turkey, July 27 .- The new Turkish capital here is springing up with great rapidity, and Angora is now the most modern and up-to-date city in Turkey.

A water system for 120,000 inhabitants has been installed, gangs working on it day and night. Since March five furlongs of the four-mile "Grand Boulevard Ghazi" have been built. It runs toward Tchankaya, where the residences of the president and ministers, embassies and legations are. It is a double highway 40 yards wide with trees planted down the centre, and even on Fridays, the Mohammedan Sabbath, work pushed along it.

QUARTER MILLION TREES A quarter of a million trees have been planted to provide the new districts with shade from the fierce summer sun and the recurrent dust storms. Nearly 1,000 residential villas, each with its own square of ground, have been built, partly by the prefecture and partly by private persons.
