### THEIR GREAT FLIGHT OVER

SIR SAMUEL AND LADY HOARE RETURN "IN BETTER HEALTH" FROM FLIGHT TO INDIA

LONDON, Mar. 15.—(Canadian Press).—Sir Samuel Hoare, (air minister, and Lady Maud Hoare returned from their flight to India "in better health" for their long and interesting journey. Sir Samuel said on his return a few days ago. Lady Hoare travelled with her husband 10,000 miles in the air, while the air minister in addition flew 2,500 miles in inspection of the air force on the Indian Northwest Frontier.


"Speaking generally," said Sir Samuel Hoare, "we not only carried out the program we had arranged, but we carried it out absolutely to time the whole way through. More than that, we carried it out without the need of any spare part or any repair either to the machine or the engine. I think that is a very remarkable feat on a flight of more than 12,000 miles. We accomplished 10,000 miles in the City of Delhi and about 2,500 miles in the military machine D.H.9. During the whole of the tour we never had a forced landing or a breakdown of any kind. That is a very remarkable testimony to British enterprise and efficiency. It is no credit to me at all, personally. I simply sat comfortably in a civil or military machine making copious notes of the interesting places over which we flew."

"I have had opportunities of discussing all sorts of air questions with the military and civil authorities in the many countries through which we passed. If I were asked to whom the credit was due, I would say that it was due to a great extent to the fact that I was accompanied by Lady Maud Hoare. It is a matter of great satisfaction to me that my wife should now hold the record of being the first woman to make a long-distance flight of this kind. Next, the success of the

officer of the Air Force, at the end of the war, and the whole way through the journey he had constantly brought home to him the great value of the closest possible alliance between the military and civil sides over these long-distance routes.

He was greatly impressed with the efficiency and the usefulness of the work of the Air Force on the North-West frontier of India. He paid a warm tribute to the efficiency of the two pilots, C. F. Woolley-Dod and Captain F. L. Barnard, and to the navigator, Squadron-leader Johnson. It was not, he said, a whole fairweather trip. Time after time they experienced the worst possible weather. There were dust storms, an earthquake on the North-West Frontier, snow and rain, and they experienced what was really the first "London" fog ever known in the history of Delhi. The day they left that city they found the aerodrome shrouded in fog almost as thick as that which London had been experiencing during the last few days.

#### LONG DISTANCE SERVICE

The flight was not a "stunt" in any sense. The machine they used was an ordinary commercial machine, designed and built for carrying on an ordinary and regular service between Egypt and Mesopotamia, and as he hoped, in the future between Egypt and India. He hoped that this was the beginning of a service that was going to be of very great value to England, to India, and to the Empire as a whole. Throughout the tour he was constantly struck with the very great interest that was everywhere taken in the conception of this long-distance service. Crowds of people met them wherever they landed, and any number of them wished to discuss with him the possibility of starting that long-distance service.

Sir Samuel Hoare, in an allusion to the prospect of an air service to Australia, said he had always regarded the setting up of an air route to India as a stage on the way to Australia and New Zealand.

#### LADY HOARE'S COMMENT

Lady Maud Hoare described the journey as an extraordinarily interesting experience for an ordinary woman. She found the flight easier and less tiring than previous short-distance flights she had made. "Sometimes it was unpleasant," she added with a smile, "but I was not the only sufferer." Referring to the different height at which they travelled she said sometimes they experienced great cold and sometimes it was hot. This raised problems of how one should dress. "I dressed in layers, so to speak," she said, "a woolly cardigan, a leather coat, and then a fur coat."

tour was due to the organizing capacity of the Imperial Airways Company. ### ADVANCE GUARD OF IMMIGRANTS

SEVERAL HUNDRED ARRIVE IN WINNIPEG FOR DISTRIBUTION IN WEST

WINNIPEG, March 15.—Sixteen different nationalities are represented on the special train which arrived in Winnipeg at 6.45 this morning over the lines of the Canadian National Railway. The total number is 367 and the ship was the Tuscania. Hungarians and Jugoslavians predominate. Thirty-three are British. Two hundred and fifty are booked as far as Winnipeg and will be placed in various parts of the west by the Canadian National Railway's colonization department. Of the balance, 51 go on to Saskatchewan, 23 to Alberta and 5 to Vancouver. Several continental families brought out under the colonization scheme of the railway are included.

Another Canadian National special is due here at 3 o'clock this evening, with 265 passengers from the Bremen. The majority of these immigrants will be re-ticketed here and distributed throughout the prairie provinces. Germans in the party number 123 and the others are Rumanians, Czecho-Slovakians, Hungarians, Austrians and Ruthenians.

This heavy movement of immigrants to Canada is what officials here term as the advance guard of the heaviest movement to this country since before the war.
