VANCOUVER HAS HURT HERSELF

COUNCIL MADE GRAVE MISTAKE IN
LAUNCHING SUIT AGAINST
C.N.R., OTTAWA SAYS

OTTAWA, Feb. 15.—Vancouver council has made a grave tactical error in launching suit against the Canadian National Railways to force erection of a hotel because the Railway heads had every intention of proceeding with the Vancouver hotel at the earliest opportunity.

This is the opinion expressed here by those in close touch with the situation, who declare that even at this time the city would stand to gain by withholding court action, which is bound to cause nothing but bad feeling and probably create a deadlock.

If the suit proceeds, it is pointed out, Sir Henry Thornton, whose production as a witness will undoubtedly be demanded by counsel for the city, will be withdrawn from his head office duties during the busiest time of the year and when railway estimates may still be before the house.

SOUND BUSINESS

Erection of a hotel in Vancouver is regarded by railway authorities here as a sound business proposition, but political observers assert that the precipitate action of the city council has merely had the effect of antagonizing parliamentary sentiment against the project. It has merely intensified the inclination to bitterness which arose when Vancouver returned four Tory members at the last election. Litigation is calculated to retard rather than hasten the Vancouver hotel project, for a long drawn out fight in the

EGG AND BUTTER MARKET STRONG

B.C. EGGS BEING EXPORTED—NEW
ZEALAND BUTTER CANNOT TAKE
CARE OF DEMAND

Eggs and butter market continues firm with heavy Eastern demands for British Columbia eggs, several large shipments of which have been made to the eastern market, resulting in a slight advance in the wholesale price. The wholesale price of butter has advanced slightly with shipments arriving from New Zealand not large enough to take care of the demand.

Fresh herring and halibut are due on the local market in a few days, at the regular first of the season prices. Plenty of crabs and shrimps continue on the market with prices reasonable. Fresh Spring salmon is not due until later in the season.

Hothouse and southern fresh vegetables are commencing to arrive with larger assortments due in a few days. Plenty of rhubarb of good quality is now selling at 25 cents per pound. Mexican tomatoes have dropped to 35 cents a pound.
