## CANNERY COMPANY IS WINNER OF ANOTHER ROUND IN ITS SUIT

VANCOUVER, Oct. 15.—The Somerville Cannery Company scored another point in its fight against control of the salmon canning industry by the federal department of fisheries, when W. E. Williams, counsel for the company, obtained an order from Mr. Justice W. A. Macdonald, calling on the department to pay the costs of litigation in which the company has become involved with the department.

Successfully defending prosecution by the department on a charge of operating a cannery without a license, the company again won out when the matter came before Mr. Justice Macdonald on appeal from the decision of Magistrate Alexander in a stated case.

The department has announced its intention of carrying the matter to the supreme court of Canada now but in the meantime, by the order made, it must put up the costs so far of the litigation.

A. B. Macdonald, K.C., represented the department.

## ONE OF LARGEST TROUT ON RECORD

EDMONTON, Oct. 15.—One of the largest fish in the trout species yet caught in Alberta, if not the largest of the kind ever caught anywhere else in the Dominion, was taken out of the waters of Lake Athabaska recently by A. A. Arason, a fisherman. The trout weighed 55 pounds, according to a report received by R. T. Rodd, inspector of Dominion fisheries. Between the opening of the season, on June 25, up to the end of August, 699,260 pounds of lake trout and 38,178 pounds of white fish were taken from Lake Athabaska by the commercial fishermen operating there. The season closed on September 30.

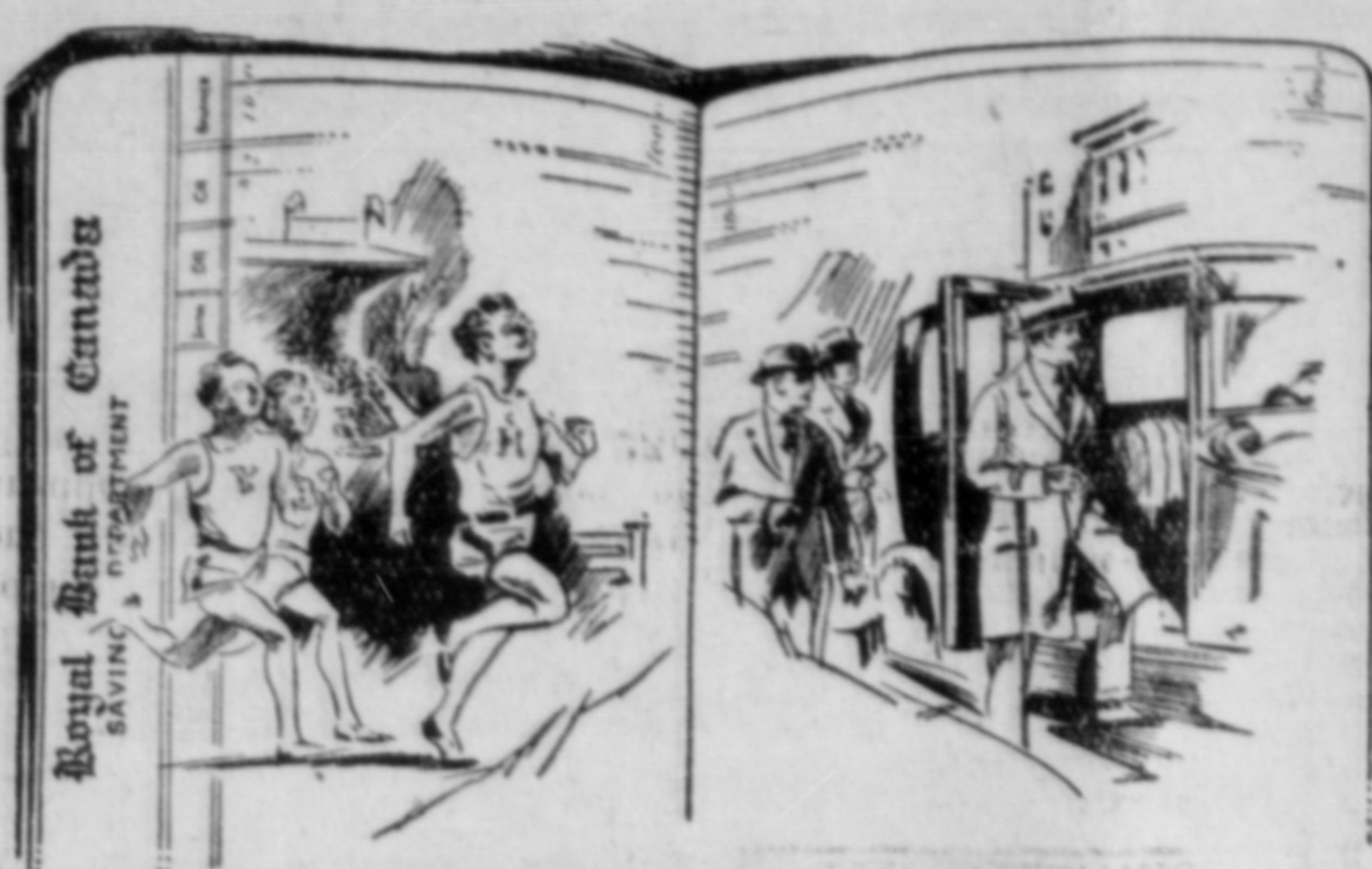

## LABOR SESSION STIRRED ABOUT COURT ORDERS

Fires of Resentment Burning at Los Angeles Convention

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 15.—Smouldering fires of the resentment of organized labor against a court injunction as applied to labor disputes broke out on the convention floor of the American Federation of Labor.

Leading champions of the working classes took the platform and gave voice to their sentiments against the new weapon of the equity court after the legal question had been brought up in a report of the resolutions committee.

The report declared that the court's action of enjoining the mandate transcends all other questions before American labor today and demanded the repeal or amendment of the Sherman anti-trust law or any other anti-trust law, and the substitution of legislation

## CIGARETTE SMOKING FOR WOMEN IS NOT THOUGHT INJURIOUS

Contradiction Given to Recent Statement That Children Were Injured

MONTREAL, October 15.—(Canadian Press).—Sixty per cent of babies born to cigarette-smoking mothers most emphatically do not die, in spite of what was said at a recent medico-physical convention in the United States by a speaker. Such a statement is characterized by local obstetricians as anything from "greatly exaggerated" to "absolute nonsense."

Dr. W. W. Chipman, professor of obstetrics and gynaecology at McGill University and obstetrical-in-chief of the Royal Victoria Hospital, compared an expectant mother to an athlete in training, and said that she should exercise as much care for her physical condition as the person who is preparing for an athletic event.

"I don't think cigarette smoking to excess is good for expectant mothers, nor for nursing mothers. But to say that sixty per cent of the children born to mothers who smoke die is a ridiculous statement. Of course, a mother should not smoke to excess, and during pregnancy, I think it best that she should not smoke."

H. M. Little, McGill, said: "Utter, arrogant nonsense! I consider that if an expectant mother can smoke a cigarette 24 hours before the birth of her child, that is a sign that she is in good condition to bear a child successfully."

His experience shows that nine-tenths of the young mothers of today are smokers.

## HALIBUT BOATS AT KETCHIKAN WAITING FOR SUPPLY OF BAIT

Word received from Ketchikan is that more than a dozen halibut boats lined the waterfront and others were berthed at the various floats, all anxiously waiting to hear where herring bait might be had. But none has been located.

Other boats have cleared for the sea fisheries with whatever scraps they could secure in the hopes that they will be able to locate bait en route. It is impossible to estimate the amount of money lost to the fishermen by the lack of bait, but when it is realized that each trip of one of the larger halibut boats means several hundred dollars, the missing of a few trips means a considerable sum.
