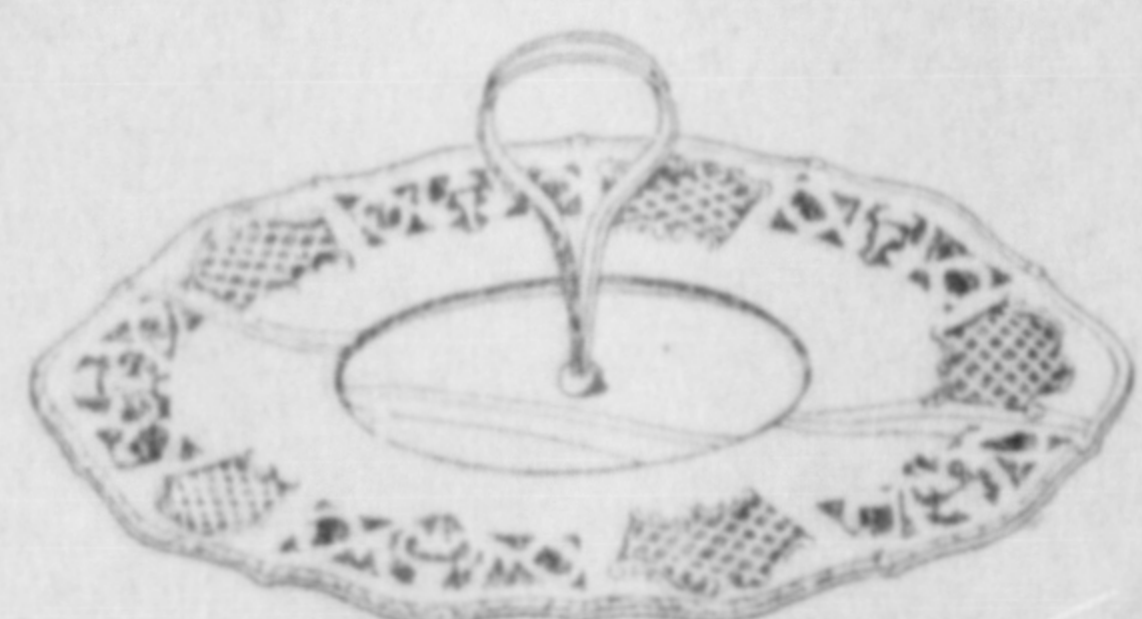

R. B. Snow of Buckley Bay reached the city yesterday after a trip to Vancouver and will proceed to the Queen Charlotte Islands on the Prince John Saturday night.

C.N.R. steamer Prince John, Capt. E. Mabbs, from Vancouver via the Queen Charlotte Islands, is not expected to arrive before late tonight. Up to noon the vessel had not reported to local officers.

Wireless reports of the vessel's position this morning indicated that C.P.R. steamer Princess Mary, Capt. Arthur Slater, southbound from Alaska to Vancouver, would not arrive here before midnight or the early hours of tomorrow morning. Over thirty-six hours behind schedule on account of snow and storms she has experienced throughout the voyage, the Mary did not leave Juneau until 10 o'clock last night. The run from the Alaskan capital to Prince Rupert will take well over 24 hours, steaming for the Princess Mary. A number of local passengers are awaiting the arrival of the Mary to go south.
