INDIAN RESERVE OPENED FOR FAMILIES SENT TO CANADA UN-DER EMPIRE SCHEME

EDMONTON, June 15 .- The opening of the Saddle Lake Indian Reserve and the placing of British immigrant families on it, is one of the best, if not the best, immigration and land settlement schemes yet tried in western Canada. The plan, which is being carried on by the Land Settlement Board in co-operation with the government of Great Britlain, gives every indication of being complete success. The 12 families that are now in their new homes on the re serve are enthusiastic about their prospects, and more than satisfied with the farms which they were allotted.

Under this settlement scheme which is officially known as the "3000 British Families Settlement Scheme," 51 famlijes are being sent to the Saddle Lake reserve. Beside the families which have already reached their farms, twelve more are en route from Winnipeg, and the remainder have left England. For
