

# A WOMAN CAME FACE TO FACE

DROWNED IN RIVER

Lure of Gold Draws Party From Tacoma to Far North to Face Disaster

and disaster defeated a party from Tacoma, Wash., prospecting in the wild and little-known hinterland of northern British Columbia, was graphically related by the survivors of the ill-fated expedition drawn to the wilderness by the age-old lure of gold. The experiences of the woman of the party were particularly thrilling.

Outfitting in Edmonton last spring. the party, headed by Deckert, with Joe Kansky, cook, and Mr. and Mrs. Morris Larson, all of Tacoma, detrained at Prince George, 400 miles west, where they took packhorses up through the "No Man's Land" of the little known plateau country north of the railway. The country is inhabited by roving bands of semi-savage Indians and few prospectors and trappers. It is a series of rolling mountain ranges, interspersed with timbered plateaus. It is said to be rich in fur, game and fish. Here, say the survivors of the stampede of '98 to the Yukon, the next "big strike" will be made.




