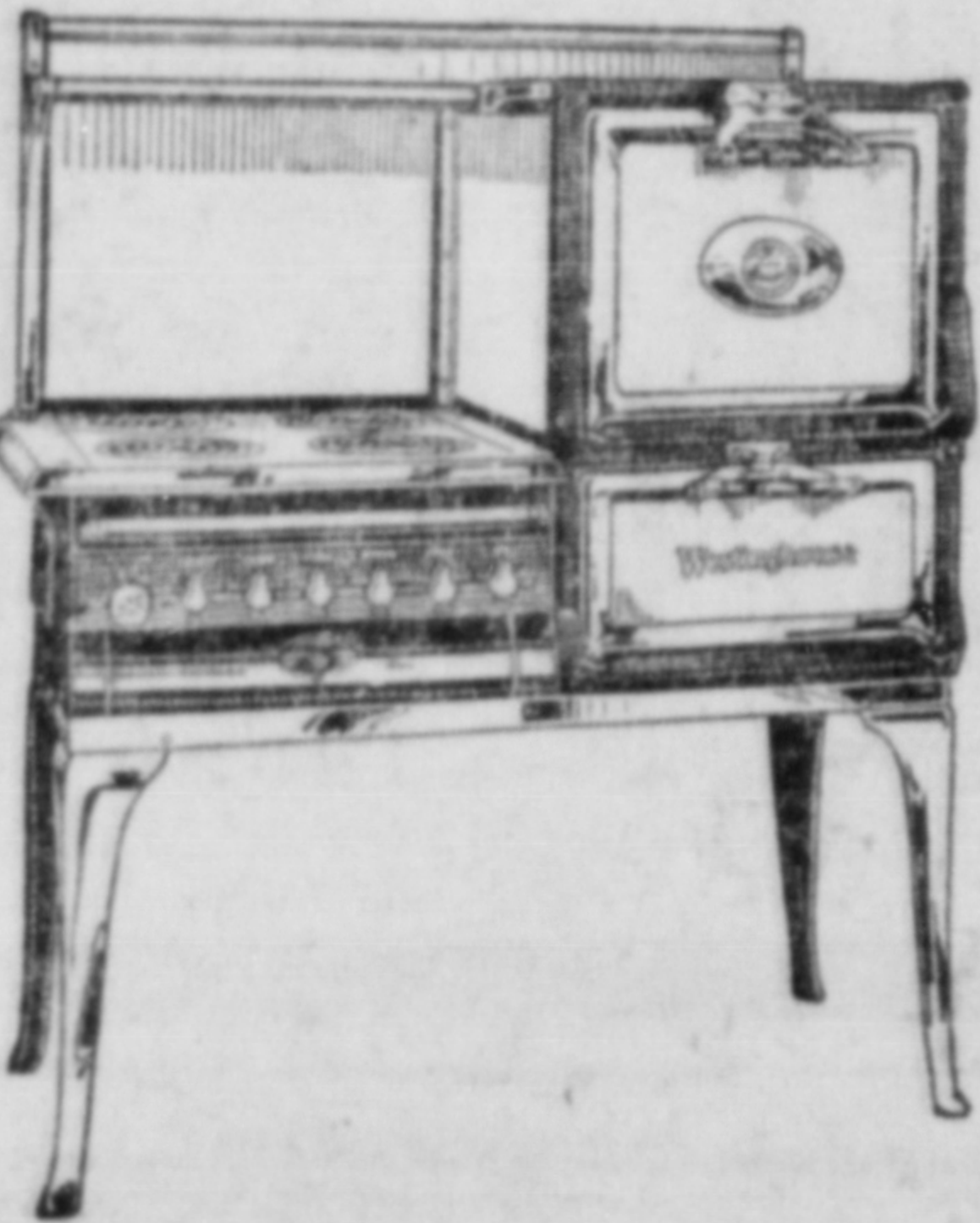

# COULD STOP FUTURE WARS

That is Opinion of George Bernard Shaw as Given in Press Interview

The "Manchester Evening News" has published interviews with a number of public men who were asked to answer the question: "Can Europe prevent the next war?" The question arose out of an article by Ramsay MacDonald on disarmament in the previous day's issue, pleading for "A United States of Europe."

Bernard Shaw said:—"I think the thing could be done without waiting for a United States of Europe, if any state really wanted to do it. England could have prevented the war of 1914-18 single-handed if she had unequivocally announced in 1913 that if either France or Germany opened fire on one another she would join the attacked party solely because she would not tolerate war on any terms, and that on the same ground she would support Germany against a Tsarist attack."

"England, Germany, and France could combine for the same end, and make it morally impossible for the United States to hold aloof, if only they would take their foreign policies out of the hands of the bloodthirsty people who are also the chronically terrified people. Holland and the Scandinavian States would join such a combination almost automatically. This would be quite enough to begin with without waiting for the adhesion of states which are about as pacifist as the Scottish Highlands before 1745."

"Unfortunately the Powers, from mere military and diplomatic habit, are still manoeuvring for the inside grip in the next war, and still defending military frontiers which are so grossly incongruous with the ethnographic frontiers that peace is impossible until they are rectified."

"Everybody applauds Christmas card platitudes about peace and goodwill towards men, but if anyone points out that the first qualification of a stable frontier is that it should be undefended (like the Canadian frontier), and as far as possible indefensible, he is dismissed from consideration as a joker or a fool. Still, a fighting statesman whose pugnacity was directed against war might make the beginning of a super-national police movement, for even our military amateurs are beginning to doubt whether we can afford so expensive a blood sport as modern war."

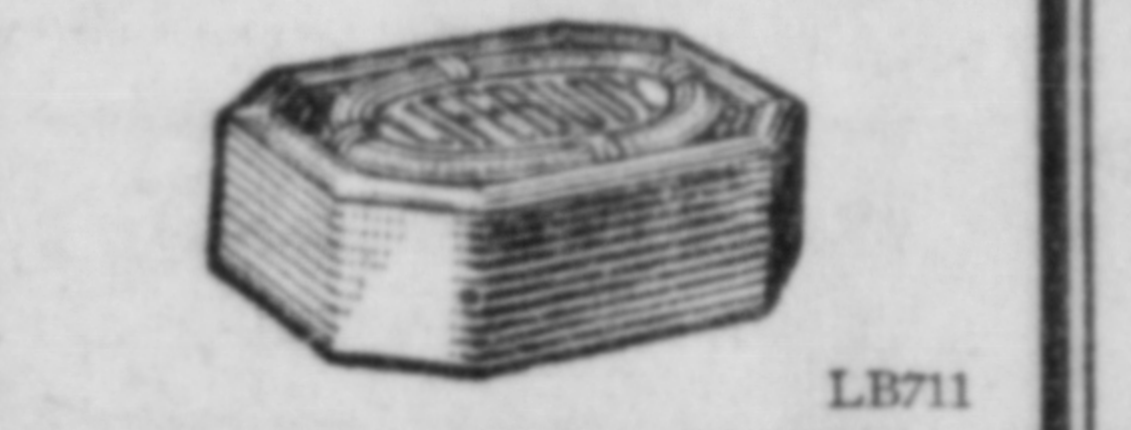

# GENERAL ASHTON ON WAY TO THIS CITY

Quartermaster General Saw Several Wild Animals When Stopping at Jasper

JASPER, Sept. 28.—Major General E. A. Ashton, of Ottawa, Quartermaster General of Canada, and Mrs. Ashton who are staying a few days at Jasper National Park on their way to Prince Rupert and Vancouver had a thrilling experience today when they made a motor trip to Maligne Canyon. They enjoyed the drive itself very much, so they told fellow guests at the Lodge, and they were much impressed by the weird rock formations hollowed out by the turbulent little stream that dashes from Medicine Lake to the Athabasca, and their greatest delight was the unexpected sight of a number of big game animals. In a trip of only six miles they saw two big horn rams, one elk and a bear. "I know the animals are plentiful in the park and are often seen close to the lodge," General Ashton said, "but this was a real surprise. The sheep were magnificent heads and they stood right out in the road. We couldn't have had a better view of them."

The General is due at Prince Rupert Thursday.

# NOCTOVISION LATEST FAD

All Actions of Person Telephoning in Dark Seen 200 Miles Away

LONDON, Sept. 28.—Sitting in a darkened room at the top of Motograph House, Upper Street, Martin's Lane, W.C., one night recently, a Daily News reporter saw the face of a Daily News colleague which had been transmitted over 200 miles of space from the Education Office at Leeds by means of J. L. Baird's new Noctovision apparatus.

This was the biggest experiment ever made in Noctovision. Previously images had been transmitted only over short distances.

"While the reporter in London watched the face of his colleague flit in staccato lines across a narrow strip of ground glass which served as a screen," the Daily News man says, "I spoke to him on the telephone. He sat in a room at Leeds. I asked him to move the receiver, grasp it in his left hand and take away the telephone stand from the front of his mouth. He obeyed all my requests promptly, and I was able to watch him and check his movements."

"The image was sufficiently clear for me to recognize faces, though a certain amount of distortion appeared inevitable."

"Mr. Baird explained to me over the phone during the demonstration that Noctovision is an improvement on television."

"In television," he said, "the subject sits in a brilliant light, whereas in Noctovision the apparatus and the subject are in total darkness. The transmission through space is done by the invisible infra-red rays."

"Hitherto by means of television we have sent figures from Glasgow—a distance of 400 miles—but this is the first occasion we have used Noctovision over so great a distance as 200 miles."

# OIL INDUSTRY LAKE TITICACA

Steamship Yapura Again Brought Into Commission Among Clouds

WASHINGTON, D.C., Sept. 28.—Another page is to be written in the already colorful history of the steamship Yapura, first vessel to navigate the waters of Lake Titicaca in the Andes mountains, the highest steam navigated lake in the world. Growth of the oil industry, reports to the commerce department say, brought her out of retirement.

Many years ago, before the Southern Railway of Peru was extended to Lake Titicaca, the Yapura was brought from England to Mollendo, Peru, completely dismantled, mounted on flat cars and shipped to the railroad of the Southern. From that point the vessel's parts were carried by mule and llama to Puno, on the lake, and reassembled, and she then was placed into service at an altitude of 12,545 feet above sea level.

Natives became greatly excited when the vessel, of about 1,000 tons, made her lofty maiden voyage, beaching forth clouds of black smoke as she churned the waters near their basket boats. After many years of service, during which time two steamers and a motorboat joined her on the lake in the clouds, the Yapura was retired. Boliv-
