

The hearing of the board while largely confined up to the present to applications for increases in tariffs have brought out both sides of every question. Various Canadian bodies are represented at the hearing of the board and where increased tariffs would affect a large body of consumers vigorous objections to the applications have been entered. In addition to the public hearings the board conducts independent investigations through government agencies and at the conclusion of each investigation reports to the government. If necessary the government will place legislation parliament implementing the recommendations of the board.

# SYNOPSIS OF

PRE-EMPTIONS

Vacant, unreserved, Crown lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 18 years of age, and by allens on declaring intention to become British subjects, conditional upon residence, occapation, .nd improvement for agricultural

Full information concerning reguations regarding pre-emptions is given in Bulletin No. 1, Land Series, "How to Pre-empt Land," copies of which can be obtained free of charge ty addressing the Department of Lands, Victoria, B.C., or to any Gov-

ernment Agent. Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes, and which is not timberland, i.e., carrying over 8,000 board feet per acre west of the Coast Range and 5,000 feet per acre east of that Range.

Applications for pre-emptions are to be addressed to the Land Commissioner of the Land Recording Division, in which the land applied for is situated, and are made on printed forms, copies of which can be obtained from the Land Commissioner. Pre-emptions must be occupied for five years and improvements made to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivating at least five acres, before a Crown Grant can be


# IMPORTANT NOTICE

All Trades, Businesses and Professions must be registered before April 30th.

Notice is hereby given that, pursuant to sub-section (3) of Section 52B of the Taxation Act, every person who engages in, carries on, or practices any Trade, Business or Profession within the Province is required to obtain from the Commissioner of Income Tax a Certificate of Registration before April 30th, 1927. Application should be made to any Provincial Assessor, from whom full information may be obtained. Certificates will be issued without the payment of any fee therefor.

Default in complying with the provisions of this section

renders the person liable, upon summary conviction, to a fine of \$10.00 for each day during which his default continues. Application forms may be obtained from any Provincial Assessor, Government Agent, Provincial Police Officer, or from the Commissioner of Income Tax, Victoria, B.C.
