LINCOLN'S LETTER FETCHES HIGH PRICE

NEW YORK, Dec. 8.—A letter written by President Lincoln to General Robert Anderson, defender of Fort Sumter, at the opening of the Civil War, has been sold to Oscar Wogelin for \$2,900. The letter was apparently written in reply to an appeal from the wife of General Anderson to the president for back pay for her husband, who had been out of the army for two years because of ill-health. Lincoln in the letter pledges his friendship to the General. The letter was sold by the Anderson Galleries from the Lincoln collection of Emanuel Hertz.
