HOW MARCONI FOUND RADIO

LOVE AFFAIR RESULTED IN WIRELESS DISCOVERY SAYS MAN WHO CON-TRIVED IT

LONDON, Feb. 14.—A boyhood love affair, and stern parents, who denied him communication with the girl, resulted in his gift to the world of wireless telegraphy, Senator Guglielmo Marconi tacitly admitted in London, in the course of a speech at the Foreign Press Association.

Long standing reports have said that Marconi, when only 19, fell desperately in love with a certain young woman. When her parents refused them any communication, he vainly tried to smuggle her notes and then attempted to wave a handkerchief according to the code they had agreed upon. His invention of the radio was said to have followed.

Asked by guests at the luncheon to tell how his idea of wireless originated, Marconi said that his first experiments with it were made in 1893, when he was 19.

"I can only say that I thought of the wireless because I wanted to communicate with someone with whom I could not otherwise communicate," he said.

"I sought a means of communication that was not dependent on weather, fog or sun as are the ordinary visual signals. That was six years before England and France were connected by wireless communication."

Asked to elaborate on his statements, Marconi refused to say whether or not he referred to his boyhood love affair.

"I do not want to start a love story," he said smilingly.

CANADIAN NATIONAL HEAD SAYS POLITICS WILL NOT ENTER UNDER HIS REGIME.

with enemies and critics which can be productive of no good; never to manifest resolute or vindictive anger but to pursue relentlessly and tenaciously our objective. No critic will ever divert the organization of the Canadian National railways from the objective I have announced. No critic can affect our record; no friend can add to it. That record stands before the people of Canada and on that record we rest our case.

The gathering was under the chairmanship of L. Smith, president of the C.N.A.A., who outlined the achievements of the organization and stated that a movement is now under way to amalgamate all the athletic and recreation organizations of the Canadian National railways into one body, which would be the largest force of its kind in Canada.

LADY THORNTON WELCOMED In a happy little speech, Miss B. E. Shannon, president of the Canadian National Ladies' Social Club, welcomed Lady Thornton into the official family and assured her of the friendship and support of all the girls in the company.

Lady Thornton thanked Miss Shannon for her kindly greetings and expressed her pleasure in being "the mother of such a handsome and growing family." Immediately after she had spoken she was presented with a bouquet of roses by the Ladies' Social Club.

W. E. Duperow, who was called upon to introduce Sir Henry, considered his speech unnecessary because "if there is any man in Canada who requires no introduction or passport, he is Sir Henry." Mr. Duperow reviewed briefly some of the athletic activities of the president and created considerable amusement, in which Sir Henry himself joined, by stating that, once when Sir Henry was being watched in action on a golf course, a member of the club finally approached him and asked if he "was playing golf or merely practicing to be a farmer" to this Sir Henry, later replied, that "What I lack in distance I make up in depth."

Mr. Duperow also thanked Sir Henry for the fine measure of support he had given all officers and employees of the company in their work and spoke of him as having always shown a disposition to "shoulder all the blame himself and give all the credit for things achieved to those who work under him," and he concluded by assuring Sir Henry that there was not a man or woman in the company who considered it anything but an honor and a pleasure to work with and for such a sympathetic, kindly and able leader.

Contributions to the program were made by Mrs. G. Kelsey, soloist, and the C.N.R. male choir, twice open champions of Manitoba, and, as Sir Henry expressed it, "the best choir he had ever heard."

The dancing which took place in the ballroom of the Fort Garry Hotel after the dinner was graced by the same absence of formality as the dinner and both Sir Henry and Lady Thornton remained until a late hour.


