SPORT FISH ARE SEEN ACTIVE IN HATCHERY WHERE HABITS ARE STUDIED

BANFF, June 14. - Many interested visitors are these days seen around the big pool at the Banff fish hatchery, for the rainbow and cut-throat trout are spawning and their operations as they prepare the nests can be easily watched. Usually, at spawning time, the few fish in the pool are caught with a net and stripped of their spawn by hand. This year, however, they are left to spawn naturally. In the same pool are several salmon trout and a few Nippigon. Both of these species spawn in the fall and just now are busily engaged in attempting to feed on the eggs deposited by the spawning species. Around the edges of the pool can be seen patches of gravel which have been cleaned almost white. These are the nests. When ready to mate, male and female choose the spot they fancy, and there, side by side, they set up a rapid fanning motion with their tails. This fanning motion serves two purposes-it cleans all the silt and mud out of the gravel, a very necessary precaution, for, just previous to hatching, the eggs require large quantities of oxygen, and if they cannot get this, on account of silt, they smother; and it also digs down into the gravel, piling the latter in two ridges on each side of the fish. 
