OLD FORT HALKETT ON LIARD RIVER IS REDISCOVERED

TELEGRAPH CREEK, Aug. 20 .- Old Fort Halkett in the Llard River country abandoned almost one hundred years ago by the Hudson's Bay Company, has been re-discovered by Allaire Delzell, trapper who has reached here from the river country. In the 'eighties an attempt was made by an expedition of the Geographical Survey to find out the old post, but without success. Delzell is probably the first white

man to visit the place since the old raders abandoned it a century ago. He found an old cabin built of squared timebrs near a stretch of water named cabin he found a quantity of powder muskets. Parchment made from cari-Delzell thinks that the parchment was provided by the Indians who apparently made use of the old fort from time

Delzell told of an exciting race between himself and a pack of twentysix wolves. He was crossing the ice on Fish Lake when he saw the wolves approaching in fan formation. SYNOPSIS OF Retail prices on the local market to-day are as follows:

PRE-EMPTIONS

Vacant, unreserved, surveyed Crown lands may be pre-empted by British subjects over 18 years of age, and by aliens on declaring intention to become British subjects, conditional upon residence, occapation, and improvement for agricultural

Full information concerning reguations regarding pre-emptions is given in Bulletin No. 1, Land Series, "How to Pre-empt Land," copies of which can be obtained free of charge by addressing the Department of Lands, Victoria, B.C., or to any Gov-

Records will be granted covering only land suitable for agricultural purposes, and which is not timberland, i.e., carrying over 8,000 board feet per acre west of the Coast Range and 5,000 feet per acre east of that

Applications for pre-emptions are to be addressed to the Land Commissioner of the Land Recording Division, in which the land applied for is situated, and are made on printed forms, copies of which can be obtained from the Land Commissioner. Pre-emptions must be occupied for five years and improvements made to value of \$10 per acre, including clearing and cultivating at least five acres, before a Crown Grant can be

PURCHASE

Applications are received for purchase of vacant and unreserved Crown lands, not being timberland, for agricultural purposes; minimum price for first-class (arable) land is \$5 per acre, and second-class (grazing) land \$2.50 per acre. Further information regarding purchase or lease of Crown lands is given in Bulletin No. 10, Land Series, "Purchase and Lease of Crown Lands." Mill, factory, or industrial sites on

timber land, not exceeding 40 acres, may be purchased or leased, the conditions including payment

HOMESITE LEASES

Unsurveyed areas, not exceeding 26 acres, may be leased as homesites, conditional upon a dwelling being erected in the first year, title being obtainable after residence and improvement conditions are fulfilled and land has been surveyed

LEASES For grazing and industrial purposses areas not exceeding \$40 sores may be leased by one person or a GRAZING

Under the Grazing Act the Province is divided into grazing districts and the range administered under a Grazing Commissioner. Annual grazing permits are issued based on numbers ranged, priority being given 25c to established owners. Stock-owners
