

To present an idea how the photographer or cameraman does his part in the making of animated cartoons, let us suppose the scene is to show Henry Cat emulating Robin Hood sending an arrow into the air. Sherwood Forest is pictured on the "setting sheet" or painted background. This drawing is placed under a frame directly beneath the camera which is focused from overhead. A celluloid sheet bearing a drawing Henry's body in standing position is superimposed over the Sherwood Forest background.
