DINNER LAST NIGHT IN HONOR OF SEA CADETS SUPERVISOR AND HIS LADY

Members of the executive of the local Navy League and their wives gave a dinner last evening the Commodore Cafe in honor of Admiral Story who reached the city yesterday. Thomas McClymont presided and, after the company had honored the toast to the King, made a few appropriate remarks. This morning, Admiral and Mrs. Story are being shown about the city by members of the executive and will leave on today's train for the east.

MAY USE PLANE TO FIGHT MOSQUITOES

Canada's Efforts Described at N. J. Association for Pest Extermination

ALTANTIC CITY, N.J., March 9.—Canada is waging war against mosquitoes right up to the Arctic circle, Arthur Gibson, dominion entomologist, told the New Jersey mosquito extermination association convention today.

He told of the discovery of the erris plant whose powdered root would specifically kill larvae of mosquitoes breeding on the surface. If available in sufficient quantities, large areas would be treated in the modern methods of dealing with the disease.
