# ALICE ARM

INTERESTING WRITE-UP OF DISTRICT MINING CAMP IN VAUCOUVER PROVINCE

Capt. George Vancouver, while explor-British Columbia coast in 1793 Observatory Inlet and drawing charts, says a write-up on Alice Arm in the Vancouver Sunday Province yesterday.

Could he have visioned the development along its shores which has brought about the establishment of the British Empire's biggestproducing copper smelter, he would no doubht have felt amply repaid for the untold hardship of his pioneer explorations.

Not until 100 years lated did the Argonauts of the Northwest Mineral District No. 1 of B.C. discover the possibilities of the vast mineral wealth contained in the mountains bordering the shores of the inlet, and only during the last fifteen years has actual production been attained.




