

The following explanatory letter has been sent to the Vancouver Sun: The Editor Vancouver Sun. Vancouver, B.C.

In referring to the Peace River Coast Railway Outlet articles written by Mr. Gldver in your papers. I beg to compliment you on the strenuous efforts you are exerting to bring about the construction of this railway which is so accessary to the prosperity of the late itself upon having such a wonderful weapon combatting on its behalf and on such an elaborate scale.

The principal object of my letter o draw your attention to the top paragraph of column six on page twelve of your October 20 issue which was mailed to Prince Rupetr subscribers, wherein it is inferred that in the event of a Railway out of the Peace River district being linked to the northern branch of the Canadian National terminating at Prince Rupert, a 500 miles extra water haul would be necessary If it is assumed that all business and out of Western Canada must necessarily pass through the port of Vancouver then the interence is correct but if it is a matter of the closest outlet via a Pacific port to the World's markets, I submit the following figures of distances:

Pouce Coupe to Vancouver via Pine Pass and Prince George 685 miles. To complete this route requires about 340 miles of new railroad constructing, and then it would travel over a grade which reputable engineers have stated wi never be of value from a commercia

Pouce Coupe to Prince Rupert via Pine Pass and Fort Fraser 635 miles. The latter route requires only 265 miles of new railroad constructing to connect


