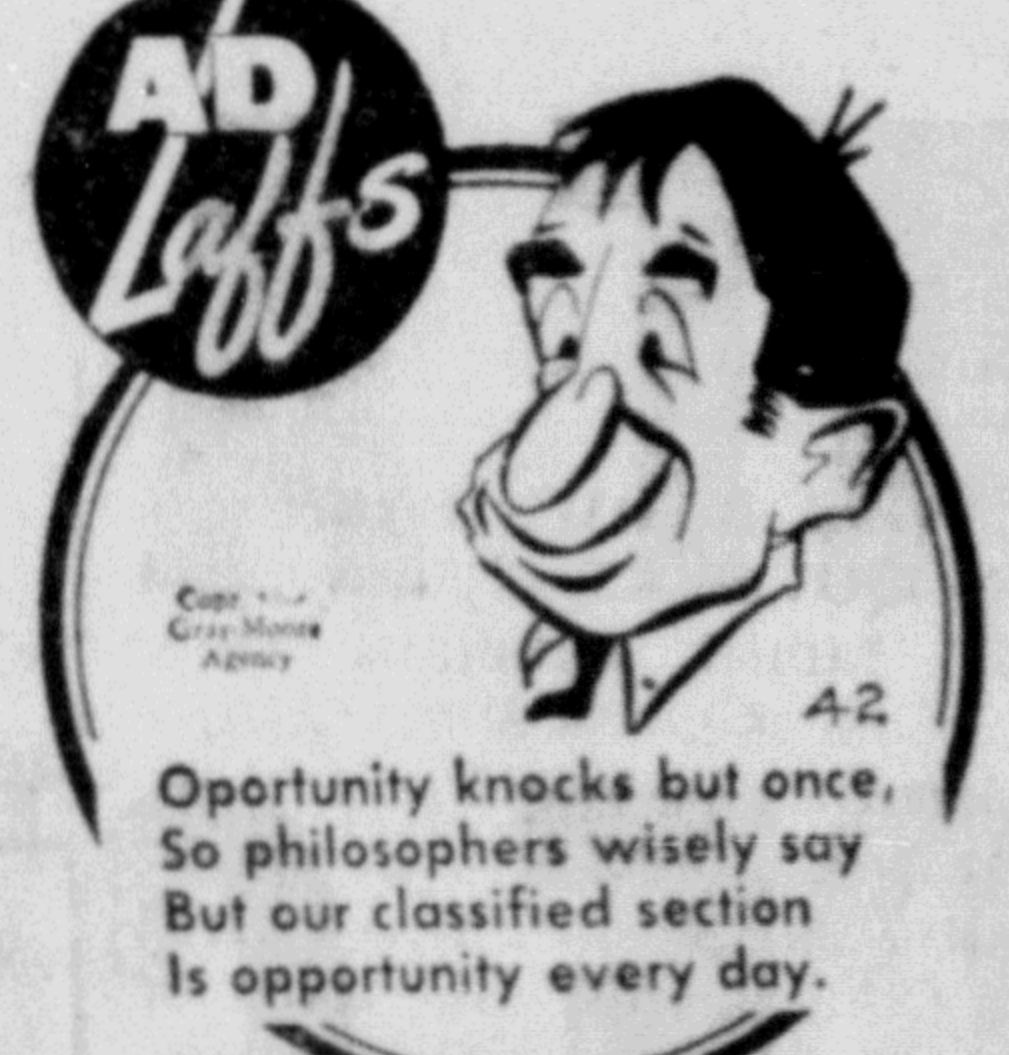

Guest of honor and witnessing his first hockey game in England, will be the Duke of Edinburgh, introduced to hockey's thrills during the royal tour of Canada last year. A number of other distinguished personalities have been invited, including the former governor-general of Canada, Earl Alexander, and his wife.

The Duke will present each player with a medal commemorating the occasion.

And the boys have a little surprise in store for the royal visitor. He will be given a small Wembley Lions sweater and a miniature hockey stick autographed by members of the competing teams. They will be presents for his four-year-old son, Prince Charles.

The all-stars, selected from London's three National League clubs—Harringay, Streatham and Earl's Court—are: Adrian Belanger, Quebec; Art Higgins, Timmins, Ont.; Bill Johnson, Winnipeg; Al Truelove, Perth, Ont.; Fred Dunsmore, Winnipeg; Vic Krekewetz, Yorkton, Sask.; Joe Shack, Winnipeg; Doug MacDonald, Kimberley, B.C.; Jim Zarie, Winnipeg; Gyle Woods, Bowman River, Man.; Fred Denny, Verdun, Quebec; Don Callaghan, Montreal; Kenny Westman, Winnipeg; Ray Maisonneuve, Goward, Ont.; and Andre Charest, Quebec.

Winnipeg's Duke Campbell, pilot of Earl's Court Rangers, will coach the all-star team.
