CONSOLIDATION Jose. OF TWO GROUPS PORTLAND CANAL

Rufus and Argenta Companies Join Forces and are in Strong Position

Reorganization and consolidation of the Rufus and Argenta mining companies have resulted to the advantage of both, in that the "Rufus-Argenta Consolidated," as the new company is known, now has a property which is most attractive for consideration of the large operating companies, several of whom have signified their intention of examlining it this season, says the Portland Canal News.

This is the statement of B. O. Erickson, one of the original locators of the ground, who returned this week from Seattle and Victoria. The two groups. which comprise 39 claims, 1,600 acres. adjoin each other and practically adjoin the George Copper, which is under bond to the Consolidated Mining and Smelting Co., who are obligated to spend \$250,000 in development work. This will necessitate a great improvement of transportation facilities, which will equally benefit all properties of the upper Bear River section.

The Rufus and Argenta were each capitalized at \$1,000,000 in shares of \$1.00 par value and under the consolidation agreement the capitalization has been increased to \$3,000,000, the added million being placed in the treasury. The company is in good financial condition, having no indebtedness, and the claims are now being crown granted.

Member of University of Montreal Party Would Have Them Become Canadians or Leave

EDMONTON, July 28.—That foreigners settling in Canada should be declared! undesirables if they do not take out naturalization papers within the five years allowed, was the opinion expressed by Hon.
