VANCOUVER, April 6 .- Stating that she was the wife of Marshall Douglas, whose battered body was found early Tuesday morning in a local hotel, "Mrs. Douglas" has telegraphed the police from Los Angeles for particulars of the case. Information has been given the police that she had been living with Douglas in an apart-

FIGHINGPROBE TO COME NORTH

PRODUCTION OF POLES AND PILES MACKENZIE COMMISSION FINISHES VANCOUVER SESSION-CANNERY AND DEPARTMENT OFFICERS ENONERATED SO FAR

> VANCOUVER, April 6 .- The MacKenzie commission, which is investigating alleged breaches of the fisheries regulaofficers, concluded its Vancouver sittings yesterday and adjourned to sit later at up-coast points as far north, it is understood, as the Skeena or Naas Rivers.

The commissioner stated he was satisfied that considerable illegal fishing had been done but the evidence so far given had failed to show that cannery owners or officials of the fisheries department had committed offences.

The commission left last night aboard C.G.S. Malaspina for Smith's Inlet where sessions will be held aboard the vessel at various canneries in the inlet and at other points along the coast. It is possible that further sessions

will be held at Vancouver upon the return of the board.
