

OTTAWA, April 6. If Premier King of Canada suddenly were to retire from public life, the next Prime Minister of Canada would probably be Charles Avery Dunning, minister of railways in the King cabinet, a man who came out to Canada as an immigrant lad from England and was "fired" from his first job as a farm hand and told he "would" never make good in Canada."

This assumption is based upon the present Prime Minister retiring from the party leadership while his party is in power, and upon Dunning being the choice of the Liberal Party of Canada to succeed him. Dunning, however, after but two short sessions in the Canadian Commons, stands pre-eminent among Liberal front benchers as successor to the leadership, and, while there would be courtesy calls to Ernest! Lapointe, minister of justice, and maybe one or two others. Dunning's seniors. the Minister of Railways, without much doubt, would be accorded the crown.

CONSERVATIVE "MOSES". It is remarkable that while the Conservatives, since the retirement of Arthur Meighen, have been casting about rather anxiously for a Moses to opposition benches in the Commons. the Liberals, if they were suddenly precipitated into the same fit, immediately Canada as of leadership caliber. 
