MOTHER'S DAY IS OBSERVED

LARGEST AIRSHIP IN WORLD IS BEING BUILT IN ENGLAND

HOWDEN, Yorkshire, England, May 9.—Three hundred persons including 140 girls, are working on the new giant airship for the government which will, it is claimed, be the largest in the world when complete, with a length of 700 feet and diameter 130 feet. Its capacity will be more than four million cubic feet and a maximum speed of 70 miles an hour. There will be accommodation for 125 passengers.

Workers are conveyed to and from the aerodrome by motor-bus from outlying districts. The experts are housed on the site of the aerodrome, and no strangers are allowed anywhere near the grounds.

FRENCH WOMEN ARE PLAYING BASKETBALL

PARIS, May 9.—Basketball is making the strides toward popularity with the women of France.

Until recently French women knew nothing about the game. Now there are 200 fairly expert women players in Paris alone and other teams in the big industrial centres of Lyons and Clermont-Ferrand. Last season six women's teams were entered in each of six series for the Paris championship.
