Ainderby Also Expected to Arrive This Week for Cargo

Prince Rupert's fourth grain ship of laby, arrived in port at 8.30 last night direct from England under ballast and is now tied up at the Alberta Wheat Pool's Prince Rupert elevator where, formal preliminaries having been carried out, she will start this afternoon or tomorrow morning loading a full cargo of grain for the United Kingdom or continent. An uneventful voyage out is reported by the Warlaby which belongs to the Ropner Line of England, owners of the "pool" vessels, several of which have loaded here. She is somewhat similar in build and design to the other "pool" boats.

The next and fifth vessel of the season here will be the steamer Ainderby of the same fleet as the Warlaby which is also due this week but whose definite time of arrival had not been learned by the elevator management up to this morning.

Railway offices this morning reported the arrival of 89 cars of grain from the prairies since noon yesterday. Over three hundred carloads are on the division enroute to Prince Rupert.

The Warlaby arrived here direct from Newcastle, England, after a voyage of 42 days. She came via the Panama Canal. Her master is Capt. Rodham and there is a crew of thirty-three men The vessel is of 3013 tons register and was built only this year on the Tyne
