Season Ends; Get Permit to Keep Meat

The shutdown and the heavy snowing ceased, and those who had not so far reduced to possession of course I mean today's daylight was gone. The deer season had now been fifteen years in which venison may be had in possession without a permit.

Game Department advised that wild meat may be kept in the locker plant, whose responsibility it is to stand for inspection at all reasonable times by the local game warden. This releases the locker from the need of obtaining a permit.

If you are canning and freezing venison in your home, you must get a permit from the game warden, which is of course free on request. Remember you still have venison remaining in which you can hunt on a moose hunt, an excellent tracking snow in Bulkley Valley now.

Perhaps somebody has a torn sleeping bag that has only had a rough and ready man-out of repair job done. A neat repair may be made by inserting adhesive tape and drawing the torn edges together, then more adhesive tape on the outside, covered by criss-crossed sewing.

Mostly the rear sight is used for vertical adjustment, so if you wish to make a lateral change on the front sight, be sure to move it opposite from the side you wish the bullet impact to be.

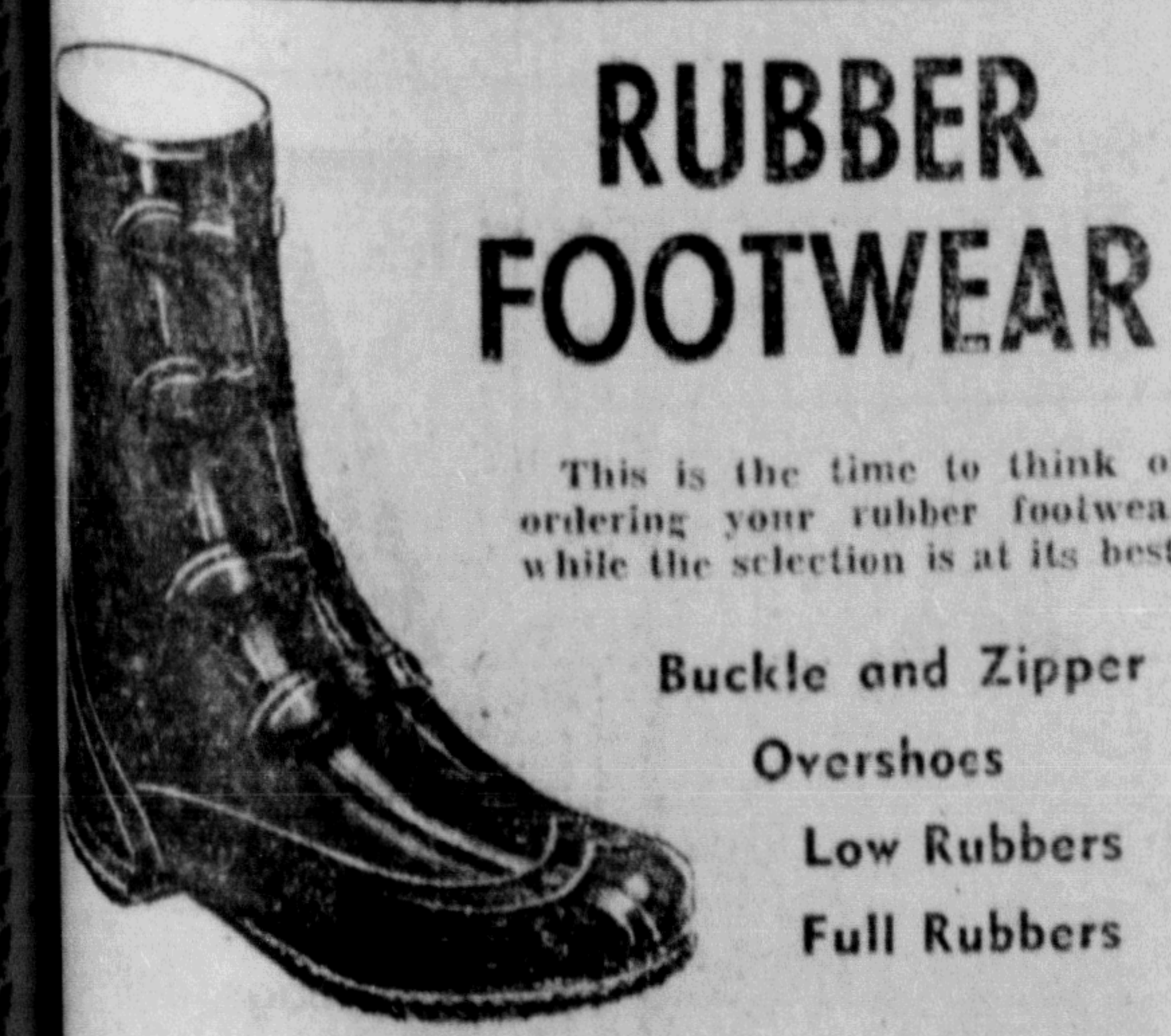
Winners in this week's series will take the coveted international high school trophy now being held by Ketchikan.
