**WHEAT GROWS ON PRAIRIES**

SEEDING CONTINUES AND PROSPECTS ARE IMPROVED SINCE LAST RAILWAY REPORT

WINNIPEG, June 6.—Except in Alberta where it was warm for the last three days, cool and showery weather with intermittent sunshine obtained in western Canada last week, but the farmers were able to get much work done and prospects are better than they were a week ago, says the seventh weekly crop report of Canadian National Railways issued today. The warm weather in Alberta indicated the effect favorable conditions will have on grain now sown, growth of wheat in that province being rapid during the last three days and it is reported to be up as high as six inches in some places.

Good growth has also been obtained in Saskatchewan and Manitoba in spite of cooler and duller weather and it is up from one to three inches generally in those provinces.

Farmers have continued sowing wheat. Some points in Saskatchewan and Manitoba state that wheat seeding will be continued until June 8, so the acreage sown to wheat is likely to be larger than was at first expected. Considerable progress was made in the seeding of coarse grains, the work varying, of course, according to districts, some points reporting 80 per cent completed and some as low as ten.

**IN MANITOBA**  
Throughout Manitoba wheat is up from one to three inches and is of healthy, sturdy growth. Unsettled weather hampered seeding somewhat but progress was made with coarse grains, this work generally being about

In Saskatchewan wheat is reported to be from 2 to 4 inches above ground and of good sturdy growth. Areas like that around Saskatoon which fear dry soil conditions, report plenty of moisture and the outlook is more hopeful.

In the Edgley district on the Qu'Appelle subdivision outcrops are reported but have done no damage. Fair progress in the seeding of coarse grains was made during the week, this work being from 20 to 80 per cent finished.

towards normal. Excellent growth has been obtained by wheat which is reported to be as high as six inches in the Athabasca district and from 3 to 5 inches elsewhere. The decrease in acreage sown to wheat will be small and this will be sown largely to flax if conditions permit. In the lighter soil area there is an abundance of moisture and farmers are quite optimistic, seeding of coarse grains has been steady and this work is generally about 60 per cent completed. The Alliance and Kelsey districts were subjected to an extremely heavy rain storm during the week and a certain amount of reseeded may be necessary there, but if the present weather continues growth will be rapid as seed bed conditions are as good as could be desired.
