MANY CHANGES MARKET PRICES

Strawberries About Finished But Raspberries Take Their Place
NEW DUCHESS APPLES
This Season Jam Appears at Old Prices But Lemons are up

It is rather surprising that the sugar market has declined ten cents per hundred wholesale in Vancouver. In view of the preserving season it is unlikely that there will be any further decline. Strawberries are about at an end. The Terrace growers had their poorest crops since construction due to the hard frosts before the snow came. Reno was better off as they had the snow heavier. Raspberries will be a fair crop and are on the market now. Large Bing cherries are at an end and sour preserving cherries may be expected in a couple of weeks. Black currants have arrived from Terrace and retail at two boxes for a quarter. Terrace gooseberries have arrived and are selling at 15c a basket. Bartlett pears should arrive at the end of the week but no price is available yet. Vegetable marrow are on the market and retail at 10 and 15 cents each according to size. Green and yellow beans are down to two pounds for a quarter. The bulk of preserving apricots has arrived. The only apples now on sale are the New Duchess which retail at 15 cents a pound or \$4.50 a box. California seedless grapes are now available at 40 cents a pound. The new season's pack strawberry jam is in with no change from last season's closing prices, retailing at 75 cents a can. A revision of the revenue tax on

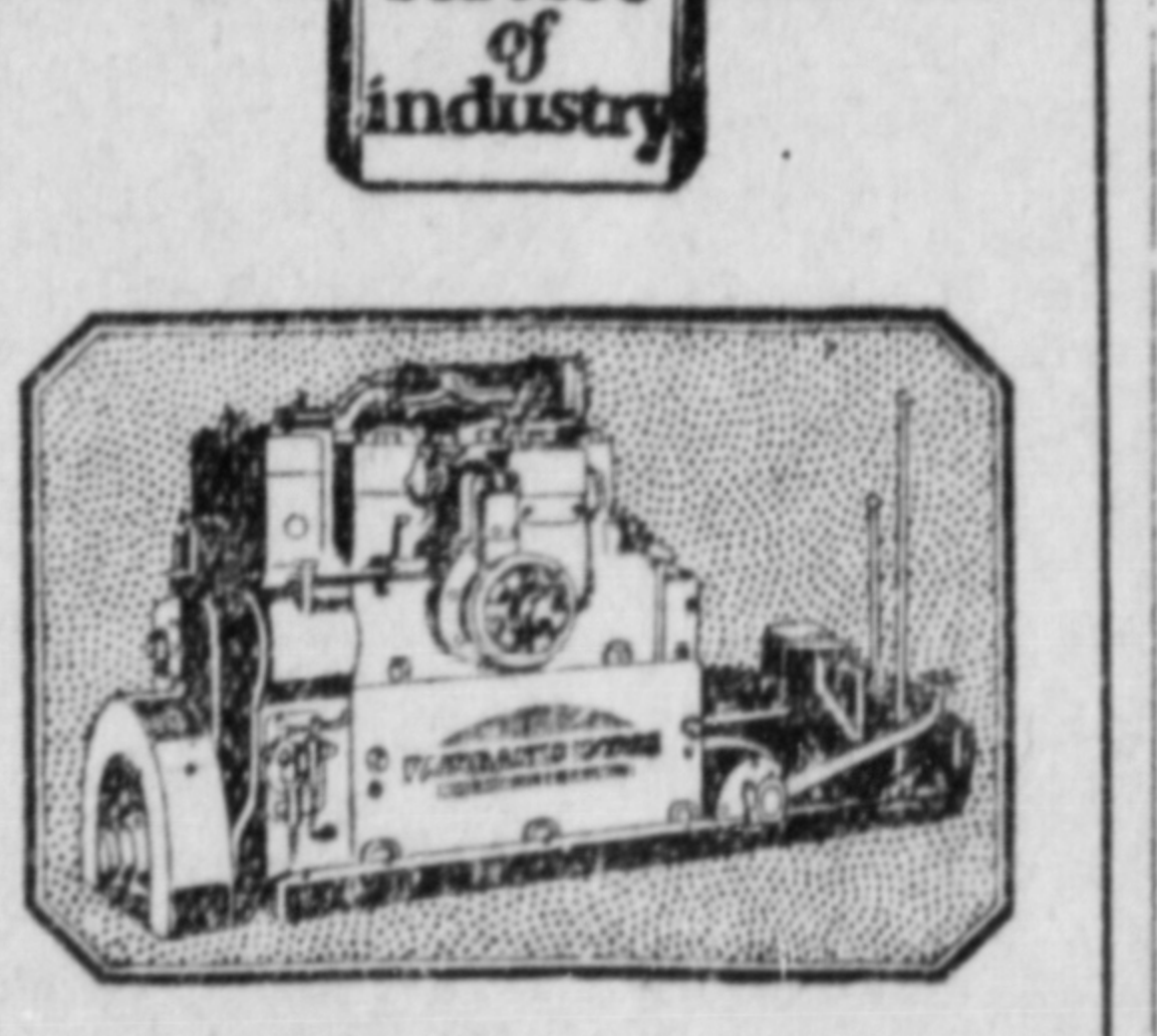
