**BUILDERS BUSY LONDON TODAY**

BANK OF ENGLAND BEING RECONSTRUCTED AND HUDSON BAY PUTTING UP HUGE STRUCTURE

LONDON, July 26.—(Canadian Press).—A prominent feature in the city today is the builders' crane. Almost everywhere the skyline is broken by the rising of some new building. This rebuilding of the city began in earnest about the year 1910, although there had been big development in Moor-Fields, around Finsbury Circus, shortly before.

The principal building under reconstruction is, of course, the Bank of England. The greater part of the interior has been demolished and a quarter of the foundations of the new structure are already in. Opposite, across the front of the Royal Exchange, a large area has been cleared for the erection of a building with frontages to Cornhill and Lombard Street for Lloyds Bank. Nearby in Poultrey the fine headquarters of the Midland Bank are in an advanced state.

In Bishopsgate the entrance to St. Helen's Place is now marked by a huge building for the Hudson's Bay Company. It is one of the outstanding new buildings of the city, the archway being according to an expert, the finest in London next to the Admiralty Arch. On the other side of the road, Hambros Bank in red brick with stone dressings is a notable addition to city architecture.

Further east is rapidly rising in Leadenhall Street and Lime Street the new headquarters of the Corporation of Lloyd's, while all the corners of Houndsditch are being reconstructed. Houndsditch itself will shortly be in the hands of the builders.

At the back of the Bank of England the new home of the Westminster Bank is under construction. The site of the old General Post Office is already covered. At the Grace Church Street end of Lombard Street, Barclays Bank is shortly to be extended. In Wood Street is rising a large telephone exchange, while a new house at the junction with Graham Street has followed a widening by the Corporation.

Romance of Country Girl Who to be Bride of Millionaire Lad

EDUCATED FOR EVENT  
Past Year Spent by Girl in Preparing Herself for Role She Must Play

NEW YORK, July 26.—Out of such stuff as movies are made of has been fashioned the romance of "Bud" Stillman, heir to millions, and Lena Viola Wilson, who is supposed to be married today.

Into this real life romance has been woven all the "Cinderella" things which cynics say "don't happen." The blonde Scotch-Canadian daughter of the Quebec forest country, who once worked in the Canadian home of a wealthy and socially prominent New York family, now is to wed the son of the house.

And even a scenario writer might not have picked a more romantic setting for the wedding. The ceremony will be held at the Anglican Church in La Tuque, little hamlet of the Quebec north country, and trappers, woodsmen and farmfolk will come to dance to the accordion and violin, and to sing old-fashioned songs in true French-Canadian style.

JUST GRADUATED  
While better known as "Bud," the bridegroom-to-be is James A. Stillman, Jr., son of the former head of the great National City Bank, New York City. Now in his 21st year, he was graduated from Princeton University with honors last month.

Miss Wilson is one of eleven children of the late John Wilson, farmer and woodsman. Some of her brothers and sisters still live with her mother in a little cottage not far from the Stillman lodge at Grand Anse, Quebec, on the St. Maurice river, 60 miles from the nearest railway. Up to the time she met "Bud" Stillman her only schooling had been received from an aged nun in the village.

The romance really had its beginning half a dozen years ago just after the death of John Wilson. Lena Wilson, then a lass of thirteen, hitched up her dog team and "mashed" to the Stillman home to look for work. She obtained a position and ultimately, with her knowledge of the French-Canadian patois, became an intermediary between Mrs. Stillman and the French-Canadian employees.

WAS JUST A KID  
"I was just a kid then, and so was she," explained "Bud" Stillman in telling of their meeting. "But we became friends when I went up to Mother's place at Grand Anse for the summers. We used to roam through the woods together, and fish and hunt.

"Then, somehow, a year ago it suddenly seemed that we became the most important persons in each other's lives and we admitted it and that's how it happened."
