NEW YORK, Sept. 24 .- By defeating the Pirates yesterday afternoon in tight 6-5 game, New York Giants re gained second place in the National League over St. Louis Cardinals and reduced the lead of Pittsburg to two-andhalf games. The Cardinals lost 3 to 2 to Boston. Brooklyn Dodgers evened up the score with Cincinnati Indians by winning a double-header from them and the stock of the Chicago Cubs further advanced when they shut out Philadelohia 10 to nil.

It was a hot finish which gave the Fiants their victory over the Pirates. Mueller was walked and scored on Lindtrom's triple in the ninth and Lindrom scored on Rousse's sacrifice.

Pittsburg needs six out of the eight remaining games to clinch the pennant, providing either the Giants or the Cardinals win all their remaining games. In the only game played in the Amer-
