GERMAN AIRCRAFT DEVELOP QUICKLY

Building Follows Removal of Restrictions Last Year Aero Omnibus Completed

LONDON, May 10.—The results of the removal last year of the restrictions on the construction of German aircraft are becoming more apparent, says the Times' Berlin correspondent. The Paris Agreement was not followed, as many people both in Germany and in other countries expected, by a rush of big multi-engined machines. Those German firms which had evaded the restrictions in a way by building and operating large commercial machines in foreign countries were able to import a few of the completed machines for service in Germany, but these were not many and it took time to transfer the construction of the large machines from foreign to home factories.

The first striking evidence of the removal of the restrictions was the construction of the Junkers G. 32 all-metal triple-engined passenger and freight and freight aeroplane, at present the largest aeroplane in Germany, which has, however, not yet finished all its trials. This machine, which has been called the "aero-omnibus," was completed so far as essentials were concerned, last autumn, and underwent a number of technical trials. This machine has a cruising radius, with normal supply of fuel, of 621 miles at a speed of 114 miles an hour. It is equipped with three Junkers engines developing 1,200 h.p. The average width of the cabins is 7 feet.

HORSE ATTACKED AN AUTOMOBILE WHILE DRIVING AT GUELPH

GUELPH, May 10.—Apparently imbued with an inherent dislike of automobiles, a horse owned by A. M. McCannell, Waterloo Road, made a vicious attack on a motor car driven by R. J. Stewart while the latter was proceeding toward Guelph from Hespeler. As he passed a farm lane near McCannell's home he heard the thunder of hoofs, and on looking up saw a horse charging at full speed toward the machine. On reaching the car the animal turned around and commenced to kick, planting its iron-shod heels against the body of the automobile and shattering the glass in the rear window. Two ladies who were riding in the rear seat were, fortunately, unharmed by the flying glass. The animal was finally driven off before it could do any further damage.

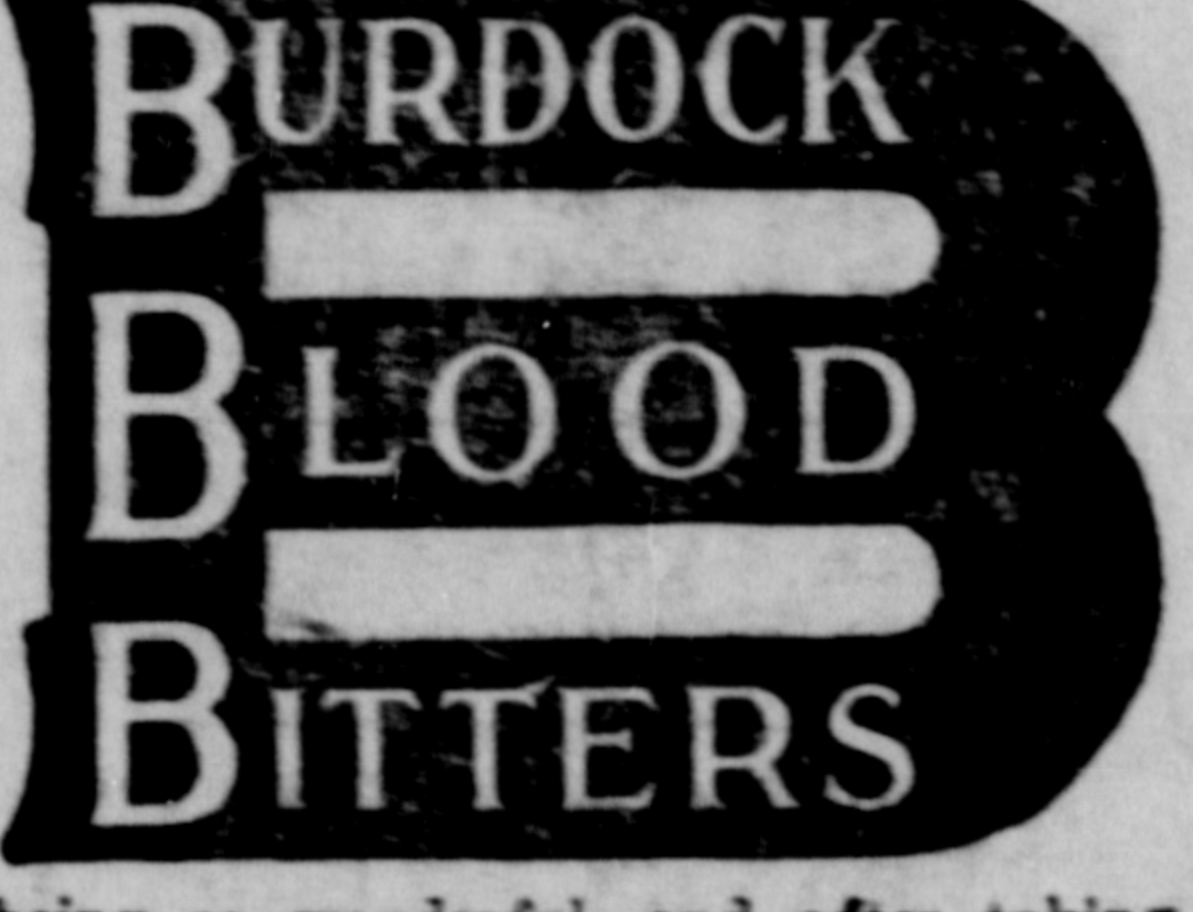
