LIGHT SYSTEM IS POPULAR

Almost Every Home Has Electric Irons but Toasters and Percolators Not Numerous

The light and power department of this city reports that 99 per cent of the residences are users of electric light or power or both. The number of residences in which meters are installed is 1268 and 1241 of these use electric irons. Toasters are not so numerous only 340 being in use. Electric percolators number 95, heaters 190 and water heaters 65. Electric ranges and stoves in the city number 70.

Commercial establishments to the number of 514 use electric light and 100 use power.

The cost of light and power is not high, an average home using, say, 48 kilowatt hours would pay \$2.56 a month.

The light and power department estimates the population of the city as 7,500.

Capt. Jack Iversen of the Pair of Jacks is reported to be still actively planning the construction of a new halibut boat which will be one of the finest of the Prince Rupert fleet. It is understood that the next few days will see the contract definitely awarded.

Booked with a heavy program of repair work and probably the construction of some new boats later in the winter, the new \$35,000 shipyard of N. M. McLean at Seal Cove, Prince Rupert, is now open for business, only a small amount of work still remaining to be done including the electrical fitting and wiring for which Ray Love has the contract.
The first boat on the ways is the salmon packer Taplow, belonging to Flewin & Brown of Port Simpson which is to undergo overhaul.

The W. and E. which is 40 feet long and has a 20 h.p. N. and S. engine, is about to be rebuilt at the Suga ways.

At last it has been settled that Mist Island is the place where the steamer Catala is wrecked. It was first announced to be Sparrowhawk Reef, which was incorrect, and the Whiff man blames the size of the waves about that time for leading him to decide out there last Sunday that it was Burnt Cliff Island, which was also wrong. A perusal of the chart under comfortable weather conditions has resulted in the third and correct identity.

HALIBUT LANDINGS
With only a few straggling boats yet to come in, following the advent of the closed season, halibut landings at the port of Prince Rupert for the 1927 season up to yesterday totalled 24,739,960 pounds as compared with last season's total at a similar date of 26,312,900 pounds. American landings to date this year stand at 18,369,850 pounds as compared with last year's 19,924,200 pounds while the Canadian total is 6,370,100 pounds as against 6,388,200 pounds in 1926.

Broken catches and low prices have featured the landings of the past week—Saturday to Friday inclusive—totaling 486,500 pounds of which 363,000 pounds has been American fish and 123,500 pounds Canadian.
The highest American bid of the week 14.6¢ and 6¢ on Saturday for the 5,000 pound catch of the Sirius. The Cape Swain received the highest price for Canadian fish on the same day—13.3¢ and 6¢ for 3,000 pounds.

One of the fishery patrol boats was despatched during the week by Adam Mackie, inspector of fisheries, to fishermen's settlements in the vicinity to advise them of the salmon conference which will be held next Tuesday evening. With many of the men now settled up for the winter, this was the only means of communication by which a number of them could be informed of the gathering.
