## MEDICAL LAWS INDIA EVADED

Much Sickness Caused by Natives Spreading Disease When Travelling

WINNIPEG, Man., July 22.—(By Canadian Press).—Men in India cause the State Railways in that country plenty of worry during the cholera and malaria epidemics, according to Dr. T. H. Bishop, of Calcutta, who visited Winnipeg recently in the course of his first tour of the Dominion.  
 Dr. Bishop is one of the chief medical officers of the India State Railways. Men have been known to disguise themselves as Purdah women in attempts to journey home while suffering from either cholera or malaria. Numerous other means of evading the medical authorities have been tried by the natives and often with disastrous results. Dr. Bishop stated.  
 Dr. Bishop cited last year as a case when evasion by the natives resulted in a malaria epidemic which proved so serious that it interfered with the operations of the trains as a large number of railway clerks were stricken with the disease.

## DISTRIBUTE BUGS IN U.S. CORN DISTRICTS

NEW YORK, N.Y., July 22.—Untold millions of European bugs that resemble small, fighting monopolies, will be loosed upon the country districts within the next few years, says Dr. L. O. Howard, chief of the Bureau of Entomology, in Farm and Fireside. The principal will be "bug eat bug," with the new European parasite being directed specifically against the deadly corn borer. The recruits are being "trained" and multiplied by the doctor at the government laboratory in Arlington, Mass., under an appropriation of \$10,000,000.
