SKIDEGATE, May 6. - The Canadian steamer Givenchy came into the Inlet Tuesday and while here called at Sandspit, Skidegate Mission, and Queen Charlotte City. Post office inspector E. M. Haynes, who was making his first trip since 1917, inspected all the post offices in the neighborhood. On this previous trip ten years ago he mushed over the trail to Port Clements.

Other government officials on the boat were J. P. Ford, engineer for Dominion Public Works; J. E. Miller. inspector of customs; and T. Mason, assistant inspector of customs.
