Coates, premier of New Zealand, and nembers of his party reach Montreal they will have a busy day ahead of them. Premier Coates is aboard the Aquitania due at New York tomorrow Present plans call for him to leave for Montreal tomorrow night on Montrealer, over Canadian National Railways, arriving here Wednesday morning. C. K. Howard, general tourist agent of the Canadian National Railways is in New York today to meet the party and conduct them to Montreal. Premier Coates and another member of the party, J. S. Hunter, official secretary to the New Zealand railways are particularly interested in railway development in Canada. They have requested that they be given facilities to inspect the shops of the Canadian system at St. Charles, Montreal and at Transcona, Manitoba. Mr. Hunter, who is also keenly interested in the development of the Deisel electric power units on the Canadian National, will inspect the oil electric cars of the company in operation with C. E. Brooks, chief of motive power of the Canadian National railways, whom he met recently while Mr. Brooks was overseas. After spending Wednesday and Thursday here the party will go to Ottawa Hunter. and thence to Toronto where a side trip to Niagara Falls will be made before travelling westward to Winnipeg and on to Vancouver.
