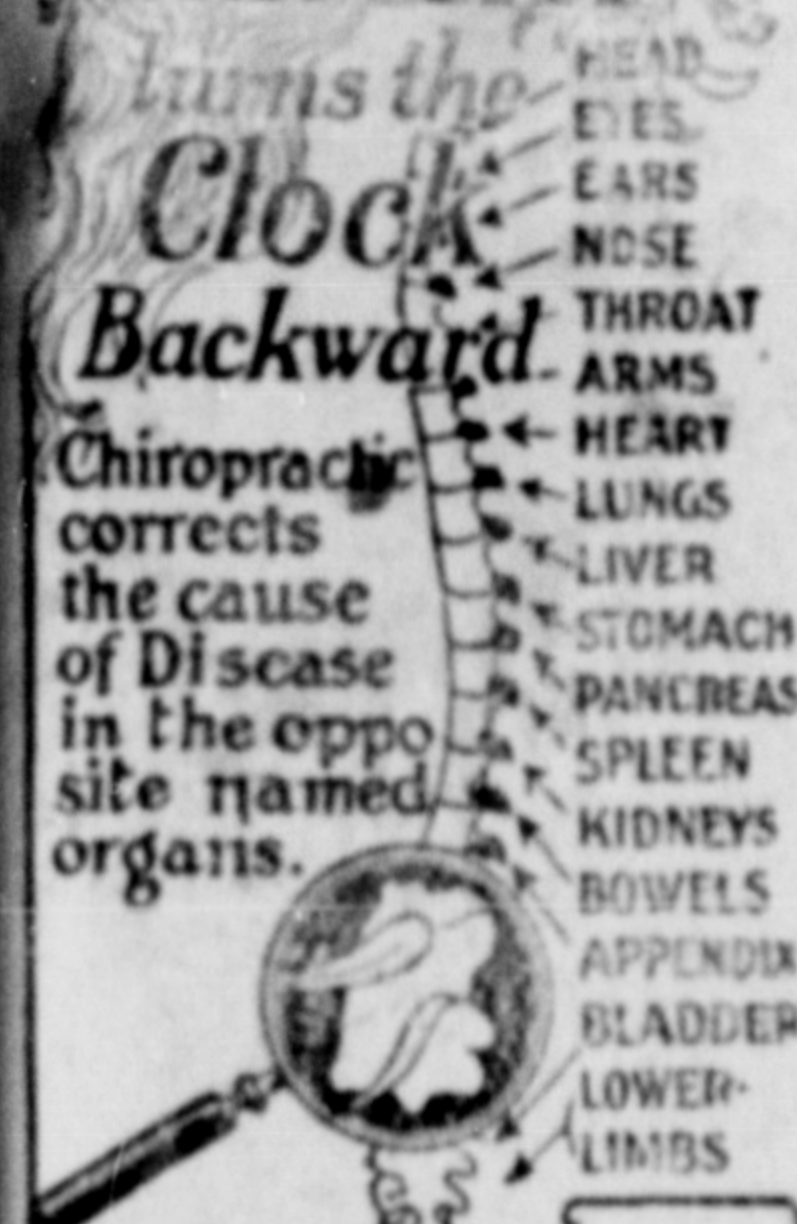

The meeting also decided to have a whist drive and dance in place of its regular meeting a week from Monday. Other important business came up which will have to be reported to Grand Lodge before publication thereof is made.
