Brewery Loan To Hotels Criticized

VANCOUVER (CP) - Chairman H. H. Stevens of the British Columbia Liquor Inquiry Commission Wednesday criticized Vancouver brewery for "lending money to disgusting beer parlors where hundreds of paralytic drunks are served."

At another point, Mr. Stevens said he had found from a personal survey some hotel beer parlors are "rows of rooms in a shack" where the liquor act is continually broken.

His criticism came after Harry Mulholland, manager of Vancouver Breweries Ltd., told the commission his company has loaned \$590,000 to beer parlors and that not one cent has been repaid so far on a \$30,000 loan to one.

Does it seem to you that your opponents often get fantastically good results from the worst bids and plays? Try not to let it discourage you. Bridge is not an exact science in the sense that the best play always wins. But the best play wins much more often than it loses and careful planning and thinking pay

handsome rewards. In today's deal Mr. Champion ran into a heart-breaking piece of bad luck when he found all of the outstanding trumps in one opponent's hand. A lesser player might have given up hope at this point, but Mr. Champion found a way to make his contract in spite of the bad break. Mr. Abel won the first trick with the king of spades. He continued with the queen of spades and Mr. Champion ruffed. The queen of diamonds was led and finessed. Miss Brash showed out, discarding a spade.

With a sure loser in both spades and hearts, it was clear North that Mr. Abel must not be per- 1 C mitted to win a trick in the diamond suit. But since he held three guards for his king, how .061/4 was that to be avoided?

Mr. Champion realized it could be done if the distribution in the other suits was just right or, in other words, if Mr. Abel could not ruff in prematurely.

After winning with the queen of diamonds he led a small diamond and finessed dummy's eight spot. Next he led dummy's last spade and ruffed it. He then cashed three club tricks and followed with the ace, king and a third round of hearts. Miss Brash won the third heart at which time everybody was down to two cards. Mr. Champion had the 10 and jack of dia monds, Mr. Abel had king-seven in diamonds and dummy the lone ace of diamonds and the
