MUNICIPAL AID FOR CENOTAPH

CITY COUNCIL VOTES \$500 TOWARD WAR MEMORIAL TO BE ESTABLISHED IN PRINCE RUPERT

After considerable discussion had been engaged in as to the advisability of suggesting that the local war memorial be incorporated with some such project as a gymnasium or library building, the city council last night, on recommendation of the finance committee, passed a grant of \$500 toward the Canadian Legion's cenotaph fund.

Ald. Prudhomme raised the suggestion of incorporating the cenotaph with a public gymnasium. He told of a meeting some time ago of the Diamond Jubilee Celebration committee at which this proposal had originated.

While he was strongly in favor of a war memorial, Ald. Brown felt that it would be of more public value if there were something other than a mere cenotaph. He was inclined to favor the suggestion put forward by Ald. Prudhomme. A gymnasium or even a library building might thus be established.

Views of Mayor Mayor McDermid agreed with the remarks of Ald. Tinker. The gymnasium project had been gone into many times. The cost would be large and the problem was a big one. He would not like to see the matter of a cenotaph laid
