Accounts for the two weeks ending March 29 and totalling \$6,195.61 were passed for payment last night by the city council. 11

A bylaw providing for the temporary borrowing of \$125,000 from the Royal Bank of Canada pending collection of 1928 taxes was finally reconsidered and adopted at last night's council meeting. 11

During the month of March a total of 1754 gallons of fuel oil was used in the City Hall heating plant according to report of the janitor, John Walker Ekley. The daily consumption was 57 gallons at a cost of \$3.14. 11

The large boulder on Sixth Avenue East in front of the residences of Jack Johns is to be removed by the city, it was decided at last night's council meeting through the adoption of a recommendation from the Board of Works which estimated the cost of the work at \$130. 11

On recommendation of the Board of Works, the city council last night decided not to entertain a claim from J. Dougherty for damages resulting from a recent automobile accident on McBride Street in McClymont Park. The city solicitor advised the council that the city could not be held responsible. 11

Ald. A. J. Prudhomme, recently returned from a holiday trip to California, was duly welcomed back to the board by Mayor McMordie at last night's city council meeting. In accepting the welcome, Ald. Prudhomme stated that, while he had seen many things of interest during his trip, he was glad to be home again. 11

Ald. W. M. Brown resurrected the matter of the much deferred street traffic bylaw at last night's council meeting, inquiring if the document was ready so it was decided to bring it up at the next meeting of the council two weeks hence. Extra copies will be prepared for the consideration of the aldermen and police representatives will be invited to attend the meeting at which it is dealt with. 11

Ald. George Rudderham inquired at last night's council meeting about the proposed agreement with the Brotherhood of Electrical Workers. City Solicitor E. F. Jones stated that he had gone into the matter and found that the council had no power to enter into such an agreement. The agreement has, however, been complied with through the recent decision of the council to increase wages of municipal electrical workers. 11

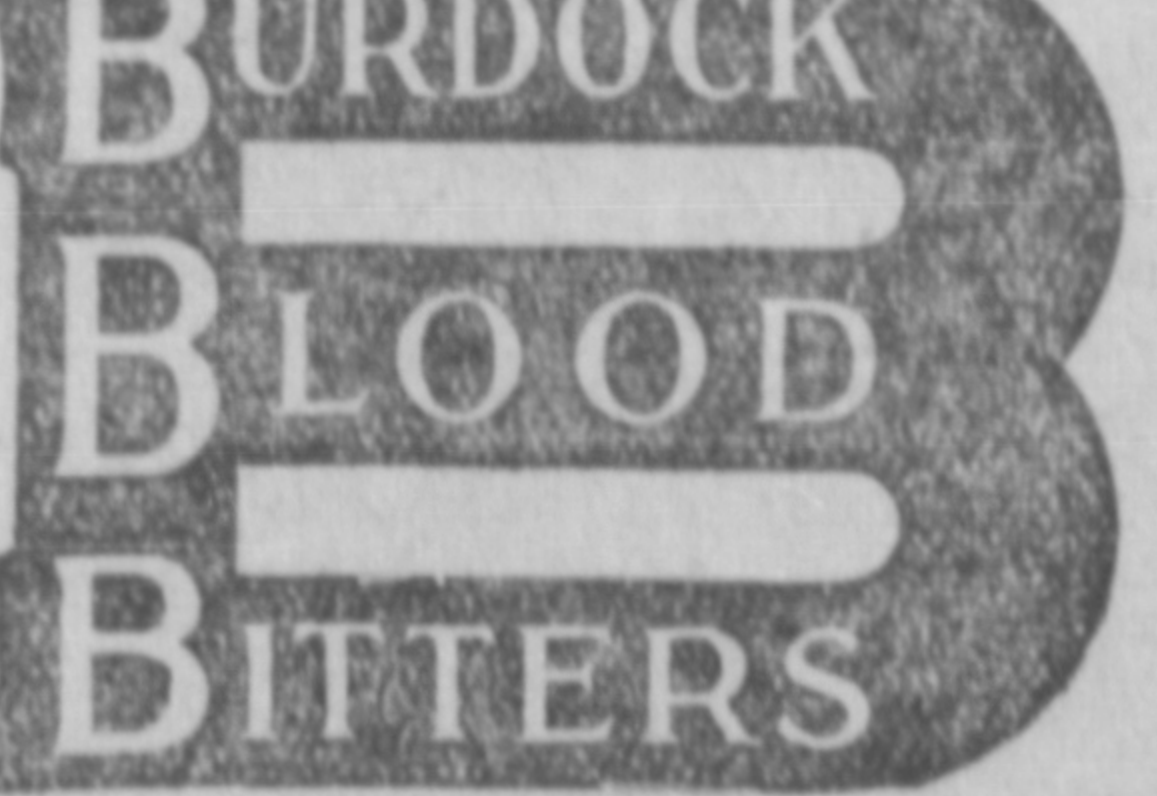

Following the promotion of Pilot John Muir to be master of the Union freighter Chilkoot, Pilot Ernest Sheppard has been transferred from the Camosun to the second in command of the steamer Cardena.

During the past 24 hours, fifty carloads of grain have arrived from the prairies for the Alberta Wheat Pool's Prince Rupert elevator. Railway offices this morning reported some 125 carloads on the division west of Jasper Park bound here.

Dr. H. S. Trefrey, who has been located at Anyox for several years, arrived in the city on the Catala this morning from the smelter town, accompanied by Mrs. Trefrey and child, and will proceed by tomorrow's train to Prince George where he plans to practice.

The fire department was called out in response to two alarms yesterday afternoon, no damage resulting in either case. At 4:15 the sidewalk on Sixth Street to the rear of Ormes drug store was ignited with a burning cigarette and, at 5:45 there was a grass fire in Westview just beyond the bridge.

Captain Stobart of the Salvation Army makes an appeal for help for a local family that just now is in need of assistance. The head of the family is a widow and the boy, who has been the chief mainstay, is at present ill. The officers of the Army ask for contributions of clothing, food and money which will be applied for this work. At present the relief funds of the organization are exhausted and this is a needful case which must be looked after. Doubtless local people will see that the response is liberal.

A communication from G. C. Mackay, district engineer for the provincial department of public works, asking the city to submit prices for the supply of crushed rock to be used in the surfacing of the approaches to the Court House was referred to the Board of Works with power to act by the city council last night. There was considerable discussion as to the powers of the city to sell rock in this manner, the city council stating that, while the city's powers were limited, it would probably be all right in this particular case as the rock was to be used on a public thoroughfare. Ald. Prudhomme told of a recent conversation in Victoria with Hon. T. D. Pattullo who stated that the government was desirous of getting the work started as an unemployment relief measure.
