

SAILS ON MAIDEN VOYAGE



The R.M.S. Lady Nelson, one of the five new vessels built for the Canadian National Steamships Fleet, in accordance with the Canada-West Indies Treaty, sails from Halifax on her maiden trip on December 14th. The photograph shows the Lady Nelson on her arrival in Canada from Great Britain, where she was built, and inset, her skipper, Captain J. M. Reith. The new ships are of 8,000 tons and their passenger accommodation was designed specially for tropical travel. Already a number of winter tours from Canada to the West Indies have been booked for the various sailings of these new steamships.

REVIEW OF MUNICIPAL CONTESTS IN PAST SHOWING MAYORS AND THEIR VOTE SINCE INCORPORATION OF PRINCE RUPERT

Now that another municipal election campaign will soon be in progress in Prince Rupert, the present mayor, Colonel S. P. McMordie, D. S. O., having announced his intention of seeking re-election, a review of past contests since the incorporation of the city in 1910 may prove of interest. Ex-Ald. M. M. Stephens is also announced as a candidate against Colonel McMordie and the report is again revived that Ex-Mayor S. M. Newton, who has already served eight terms, may once more be in the field. No other candidates are being seriously mentioned.

Prince Rupert has so far gone to the polls nineteen times to elect a mayor and aldermanic board. Mr. Newton has been elected eight times. Other mayors and their periods of service have been as follows:

Fred Stork, one term; William Manson, one; T. D. Pattullo, one; M. P. McCaffery, two; Thomas McClymont, three; H. B. Rochester, two; Colonel McMordie, one.

MIDNIGHT FIRE CAUSES DAMAGE

Flames of Mysterious Origin Break Out in Store of B. C. Fur Co.

Fire of mysterious origin at midnight Saturday did considerable damage to the interior and stock of the B. C. Fur Co.'s store on Third Avenue, near the corner of Fourth Street, and, had it not been caught in time, might have been attended with much more serious results in that part of the business section.

F. E. Robertson, manager of the Royal Bank of Canada, as he was passing at 12:20 a.m., noticed smoke and flames inside the store and rushed up to the Fire Hall to turn in a still alarm. The store inside was in flames when the department arrived on the scene and it was necessary to break in the door to make entry. The blaze was soon subdued with the use of chemicals and there was no damage to adjoining premises.

Fur goods in the store also figured in the loss. The fire department and the proprietor, A. Richmond, were unable to account for the starting of the blaze.


